The Registrant will render advice on U.S. laws, regulations and policies and will represent the foreign principal with respect to actions of the United States Government that might lead to restrictions on imports of softwood lumber, shakes and shingles, and fence from Canada. The Registrant will represent the foreign principal before the United States Department of Commerce in a countervailing duty investigation (docket number 122015) and before the United States International Trade Commission in investigations numbers 701-TA-197; 701-TA-198; and 701-TA-199. The fee for such representation is to be determined periodically based on usual hourly charges and other criteria for legal fees, plus out-of-pocket expenses. The duration of the agreement is indefinite.

5. Describe fully the activities the registrant engages in or proposes to engage in on behalf of the above foreign principal.

The Registrant has rendered and will render advice to the foreign principal with respect to U.S. laws, regulations and policies and will represent the foreign principal with respect to actions of the United States Government that might lead to restrictions on imports of softwood lumber, shakes and shingles, and fence from Canada. The Registrant will represent the foreign principal before the United States Department of Commerce in a countervailing duty investigation (docket number 122015) and before the United States International Trade Commission in investigations numbers 701-TA-197; 701-TA-198; and 701-TA-199.

The Registrant engages and will engage in activities on behalf of the foreign principal that do not require registration under the Act. The Registrant is registering because some of its activities may require such registration.
