FRENCH EXPOSITIONS IN THE U.S., INC.

EXHIBIT B

There is no formal written agreement between FRENCH EXPOSITIONS IN THE U.S., INC. and the "COMITÉ PERMANENT DES FOIRES ET MANIFESTATIONS à L'ETRANGER." However, basically the arrangement between them is as follows.

In other countries, the "COMITÉ PERMANENT DES FOIRES ET MANIFESTATIONS à L'ETRANGER" itself organizes trade shows for the promotion of French products. However, due to the large number of trade fairs and shows in the United States, FRENCH EXPOSITIONS IN THE U.S., INC. was incorporated to perform that function in this country.

FRENCH EXPOSITIONS IN THE U.S., INC. is furnished an annual subsidy, paid quarterly, by the "COMITÉ PERMANENT DES FOIRES ET MANIFESTATIONS à L'ETRANGER" (the 1964 subsidy was \$ 169,000) for corporate expenditures such as salaries, rental of office space, travel and advertising expenses in connection with the organization of trade shows and promotion of French products. Whatever balance remains of the annual subsidy at the end of the year is returned to the "COMITÉ PERMANENT DES FOIRES ET MANIFESTATIONS à L'ETRANGER."
