

ROYAL DECREE  
Establishing the Tourist Organization  
B.E. 2502

(Amended by Royal Decree Establishing the Tourist Organization (No.2) B.E.2506)

Bhumibol Adulyadej P.R.  
Given on the 28th day of July B.E. 2502  
Being the 14th year of the Present Reign

By Royal Command of His Majesty King Bhumibol Adulyadej it is hereby proclaimed that

Whereas it is proper to establish a Tourist Organization of Thailand His Majesty the King, by virtue of the power conferred in Section 3 of the Government Organizations Incorporation Act B.E. 2496, is graciously pleased to enact a Royal Decree as follows :

Section 1            This Royal Decree shall be called the Royal Decree establishing the Tourist Organization of Thailand B.E. 2502

Section 2            This Royal Decree shall come into force on and from the day following its publication in the Government Gazette

Section 3            In this Royal Decree :

                         "Employee" means persons working in the Tourist Organization of Thailand, other than the Director and Deputy Director

                         "Director" means the Director of the Tourist Organization of Thailand

                         "Deputy Director" means the Deputy Director of the Tourist Organization of Thailand

                         "Member" means the member of the Tourist Organization of Thailand

                         "Tourist Promotion Board" means the Tourist Promotion Board of the Tourist Organization of Thailand

                         "Tourist Industry" means Businesses and Services concerning Tourism both inside and outside the Kingdom including hotel, transportation, and guide business.

Section 4            An organization shall be established and called the "Tourist Organization of Thailand" abbreviated "ต.ส.ท."

                         In English, it shall be called "Tourist Organization of Thailand" abbreviated "TOT"

Section 4 bis.      The insignia of TOT shall be the figure of the Phra Prang of Wat Arun Rajvararam above which is representation of an airplane passing the Phra Prang and below the representation of the Royal Barge Suphanahongs, all three within a circle, the edge of which at the top bears the letters "ต.ส.ท." and at the bottom the words "TOURIST ORGANIZATION OF THAILAND" as per the specimen annexed hereto

Section 5      TOT shall have its main office in Changvad Phra Nakorn (Bangkok) and may establish branches or agents at any place inside or outside the Kingdom .

Section 6      The objectives of TOT are as follows :

- (1) to promote the tourist industry in the interests of the national economy and to propagare those aspects of Thailand : culture, arts, customs, dance, sports etc. which will attract or interest tourists,
- (2) to assist, advise, and cooperate in the establishment and conduct of private tourist industry,
- (3) to survey, construct, promote, or maintain places appropriate for tourists,
- (4) to communicate and cooperate with Organizations or societies for the promotion of tourism at home or abroad,
- (5) to engage in tourist industry in cases where private persons are unable to do so alone or in cases assigned by the government,
- (6) to engage in other business concerning or in the interest of the tourist industry.

Section 7      To carry out the objectives mentioned in Section 6, TOT shall have powers including the following :

- (1) to watch the conduct of privately operated tourist services to prevent harm to tourists or damage or danger to the nation,
- (2) to advise government units or organizations concerning to the tourist industry in order to improve facilities or induce foreign tourists to come to Thailand or tourists in Thailand to visit different parts of the Kingdom ,
- (3) to search for and collect evidence from government units, government organizations and private persons engaged in tourist industry in the interest of preparing statistics concerning the tourist industry.

Section 8      The capital of TOT is fixed at twelve million baht, the government contributing initial capital of two million baht further amounts as seen fit by the government to be contributed thereafter from time to time.

Section 8 bis.      The capital of TOT shall be increased from twelve million baht by eighteen million baht to a total of thirty million baht to be paid by the government from time to time in such amounts as it may think fit.

Section 9      Annual Income of TOT from operations may be used for its business expenses to the extent prescribed by the Tourist Promotion Board.

Annual Income of TOT after deduction of expenses may be accumulated for subsequent expenditure.

Section 10      is repealed by Section 6 of the Royal Decree establishing the Tourist Organization (No.2) B.E. 2506

Section 11 The President of the Council of Ministers or person delegated by him shall have the power and duty in general to control the business of TOT, and for this purpose the President of the Council of Minister or his delegate shall have the power to summon the chairman of the Board, Members, Director, Deputy Director, employees or other persons in TOT to give information, opinions or to submit reports as well as the power to enjoin any act of TOT thought to be in conflict with policy or resolutions of the Council of Ministers.

Section 12 There shall be a Tourist Promotion Board to administer the business of TOT to be called "The Tourist Promotion Board of the Tourist Organization of Thailand" composed of a chairman and at least nine and not more than nineteen other members including a representative of the Ministry of Finance and a representative of the Budget Bureau.

The Chairman of the Board and Members shall be appointed by the President of the Council of Ministers.

Section 13 The Tourist Promotion Board shall with the approval of the President of the Council of the Ministers appoint a Director and **Deputy** Director to conduct the business of TOT in accordance with the policies of the Tourist Promotion Board.

Members or others may be appointed Director or Deputy Director.

Section 14 The following are disqualified for appointment as Director or Deputy Director :

(1) those having an interest in a contract with TOT or in work done for TOT whether directly or indirectly unless such interest consists in being a partner with limited liability in a limited partnership or a holder of shares in a limited company having such interest;

(2) Employees

Section 15 The chairman of the Board, Members, Director, and Deputy Director shall be deemed to vacate office upon,

(1) death

(2) resignation

(3) discharge by the President of the Council of Ministers

(4) disqualification under Section 14

Section 16 The President of the Council of Ministers shall determine the remuneration for the chairman of the Board and Members.

The Tourist Promotion Board shall determine gratuities and bonuses for the chairman of the Board, Member, Director, Deputy Director and Employees which shall be referred to the President of the Council of Ministers for approval

Section 17 The Tourist Promotion Board shall have the power and duty to lay down policy and control and supervise in general the operations of TOT and shall have also the following powers and duties:

- (1) to conduct business under Sections 6 and 7
- (2) to prescribe bye-laws for the conduct of meetings and business of the Tourist Promotion Board.
- (3) to prescribe bye-laws concerning placement, appointment, salary increases, cuts and reductions, removal of employees as well as position and salary scales, salaries and other payments to employees,
- (4) to prescribe regulations governing the operations of TOT and disciplinary rules and penalties for employees and other similar matters,
- (5) to prescribe salary scale as well as salary increases, reductions, or cuts of the Director and Deputy Director, with the approval of the President of the Council of Ministers,
- (6) to fix interest rates, obligation and service fees, and other operational costs,
- (7) to prescribe the rate of an interest on savings funds of the Director, Deputy Director, employees and to prescribe rules for the refund of savings deposits.

Powers and duties prescribed in (1) (3) (4) and (6) may when the Tourist Promotion Board thinks fit be delegated to the Director.

If any of the said bye-laws laid down by the Tourist Promotion Board contains provisions limiting in any respect the power of the Director or Deputy Director to perform legal acts, the President of the Council of Ministers shall publish such bye-laws in the Government Gazette.

Section 18 The Director shall have the power and duty to conduct the affairs of TOT in accordance with the policy and bye-laws prescribed by the Tourist Promotion Board and shall have power to direct employees of every position.

The Director shall be responsible to the Tourist Promotion Board for the conduct of the affairs of TOT.

Section 19 In dealings with third persons, the Director shall be the agent of TOT and for this purpose may authorize the Deputy Director or any other person to do certain things in his stead.

Section 20 The Director shall have the following powers and duties as well :

(1) to place, appoint, remove, as well as penalize employees, increase, reduce, or cut their salaries in accordance with the bye-laws of TOT

(2) to prescribe rules for the conduct of the business of TOT which are not inconsistent with or opposed to the policies and bye-laws prescribed by the Tourist Promotion Board.

(3) to prescribe dress and rules for dress of employees for the sake of good order and suitability, with the approval of the Tourist Promotion Board.

Section 21 The Assistant Director shall have the power and duty to conduct the affairs of TOT as may be assigned by the Director.

In the event, for any reason, the Director is unable to perform his duties, the Deputy Director shall act for him. If the Director and the Deputy Director are unable to act, the Tourist Promotion Board shall appoint a Member or other person as Acting Director

In the performance of his duties, the Deputy Director or the Acting Director under paragraph 2, shall have the same powers and duties as the Director.

Section 22 TOT shall open a deposit account with the Bank of Thailand

Section 23 TOT shall establish and observe a correct system of accounting divided according to the major divisions of work, with a regular internal audit and the following account books:

(1) receipts and expenses,

(2) assets and liabilities,

which show the actual working truthfully and as may be appropriate, according to the classifications of work together with an account of the background of such entries.

Section 24 Every year the Office of the State Audit Commission shall audit the accounts and finances of TOT

Section 25 The auditors shall have the power to audit all books, accounts, and documentary evidence of TOT and to this end shall have the power to question the Chairman of the Board, Member, Director, Deputy Director, employees, agents, and any person in TOT

Section 26 The auditor shall make a report of the results of the audit and submit it to the President of the Council of Ministers within one hundred and twenty days from the last day of the accounting year of TOT

Section 27 The auditors shall make a report consisting of a text, explanations as may be appropriate to the audit of the accounts received as well as a reference to the completeness of the books, accounts kept by TOT and shall declare

(1) whether or not the balance sheet and accounts which have been audited are in agreement with the books and accounts;

(2) whether or not the balance sheet and accounts audited show the actual working of TOT truthfully and as may be appropriate according to the text, explanation, and knowledge of the auditors.

Section 28 The Director shall make an annual report for the preceding year for submission to the Tourist Promotion Board showing the balance sheet, working accounts, and profit and loss statement certified by the auditors to be correct within one hundred and fifty days from the last day of the accounting year of TOT

Section 29 The Tourist Promotion Board may organize a Tourist Society to submit opinions and proposals to the Tourist Promotion Board.

This Society shall be under the patronage of TOT

Section 30 The President of the Council of Ministers shall be in charge under this Royal Decree.
