

International Public Relations d/b/a JSIC communicates directly with Kozai Club via IPR-Tokyo intermediation using mail, telex and cable. Public relations programs are discussed and approved by Kozai Club. A physical office -- Japan Steel Information Center conducts U.S. activities in New York City and a branch office operates in Los Angeles.

5. Describe fully the activities the registrant engages in or proposes to engage in on behalf of the above foreign principal.

The registrant develops and issues a variety of "news" material -- news releases, feature articles, reprints, brochures, films, etc., on the Japanese steel industry, U.S.-Japan steel trade and related subjects.

The registrant also follows closely political and trade developments in the U.S. which may affect U.S.-Japan steel transactions. This activity includes reading of various publications, attendance at Congressional hearings, steel industry presentations and similar events.


The registrant does not represent the principal in any dealings with the Government, commercial transactions and similar areas.

^{1/} Political activity as defined in Section 1(o) of the Act means the dissemination of political propaganda and any other activity which the person engaging therein believes will, or which he intends to, prevail upon, indoctrinate, convert, induce, persuade, or in any other way influence any agency or official of the Government of the United States or any section of the public within the United States with reference to formulating, adopting, or changing the domestic or foreign policies of the United States or with reference to the political or public interests, policies, or relations of a government of a foreign country or a foreign political party.

Attachment A

Understanding between registrant and foreign principal arranged through an intermediary -- International Public Relations Co., Ltd., Tokyo, Japan, an affiliate of the registrant. Fees and expenses for the registrant are obtained from Kozai Club in Japan via IPR-Tokyo. Representation of Kozai Club renewed annually on April 1 fiscal year basis with IPR-Tokyo as intermediary.

Registrant receives approximately \$45,600 annually in fees, of which \$12,000 is forwarded to Jack Whitehouse, an affiliated public relations executive in Los Angeles.

Annual expenses total approximately \$20,340 and includes office rental, secretarial salaries, printing, stationary, publication purchases and other related expenses. Of this amount, approximately \$2,800 is forwarded to Mr. Whitehouse for his expenses.
