The Committee functions through meetings called by the Chairman whenever a need for discussion arises or at the request of any member. The Chairman then implements the members' decisions taken at such meetings. Between meetings, the Chairman circulates written materials on subjects of interest to the membership.

5. Describe fully the activities the registrant engages in or proposes to engage in on behalf of the above foreign principal.

The New York Committee of International Committee of Passenger Lines was formed for the purpose of engaging in the following activities:

- 1) To facilitate passenger travel by sea;
- 2) To keep the member lines promptly informed of all proposals, official and unofficial attitudes, legislation and general Ainancial and economic trends and events in the United States which might affect the members' interests as carriers of passengers to and from the United States;
- 3) To serve as a means through which the members might communicate their views and opinions to United States Government officials other passenger lines, and travel agents on problems and issues affecting steamship passenger travel.

6. Will the activities on behalf of the above foreign principal include political activities as defined in Section 1(o) of the Act?1/ Yes [X] No [7]

If yes, describe all such political activities indicating, among other things, the relations, interests or policies to be influenced together with the means to be employed to achieve this purpose.

In keeping with their fundamental aim of facilitating passenger travel by sea, the members of the N.Y. Committee of International Committee of Passenger Lines favor:

- 1) The simplification of: vessel entry and clearance procedures; inspections by U.S. agencies; certification of passenger vessels owners' financial responsibility as required by U.S. law; water pollution regulations' regulations governing required navigational aids on board vessels;
- 2) Maintenance of Panama Canal Tolls at economically justifiable levels; and
- 3) Retention of the principle of a fair and reasonable limitation of shipowners liability.

In support of these positions, the Committee Chairman - either alone or accompanied by representatives of the member lines - will commonicate with members of Congress and officials of the Department of State, U.S. Coast Guard, Federal Maritime Commission, Department of Transportation, Environmental Protection Agency, Department of Health Education and Welfare (U.S. Public Health Service), orally or in writing.
