Your Excellency:

Squire Patton Boggs (US) LLP ("SPB") remains deeply honored to advise the Office of the Presidency of the Government of Angola (the "Government"). The Government has now requested that SPB expand its scope of work described in the Engagement Agreement between SPB and the Government dated June 18, 2019 (the "Engagement Agreement"), as amended by the subsequent agreement between SPB and the Government dated June 17, 2020 (the "First Amendment").

In this agreement (the "Second Amendment"), the Government and SPB (collectively, the "Parties") agree, as follows:

1. SPB will expand the scope of work described in the Engagement Agreement to include advising the Government on strategic communications.
2. Upon signature of this Second Amendment, the Government will make a supplemental payment of US\$600,000, covering the expanded scope of work for the period February 18, 2021 through June 17, 2021 (the "Supplemental Payment"). SPB will bill against the Supplemental Payment at a rate of US\$150,000 per month for this additional scope of work.

Except as expressly stated herein, all other terms of the Engagement Agreement and the First Amendment shall continue in full force and effect.

Please confirm your acceptance of this Second Amendment by countersigning the enclosed copy of this letter and returning it to me. If you do not agree with one or more of the provisions of this Second Amendment, please contact me so that we can try to address your concerns. You should also feel free to consult with independent counsel before signing. Throughout our relationship, we want you to be satisfied with the professional services that we perform on your behalf.




