

Registrant will analyze the budgetary decision-making process for security assistance and development assistance programs in both the executive and congressional branches of government and will provide advice and consultations with regard to identified opportunities for strengthening the relationship between Gabon and the United States through these programs.


5. Describe fully the activities the registrant engages in or proposes to engage in on behalf of the above foreign principal.
