

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AGREEMENT

This agreement is entered into by and between the JAPAN IRON & STEEL EXPORTERS' ASSOCIATION (hereinafter referred to as JISEA) and INTERNATIONAL PUBLIC RELATIONS CO., LTD. (CALIFORNIA) (hereinafter referred to as IPR) with respect to the execution of public relations services on behalf of JISEA.

Article I

IPR shall conduct public relations and information-gathering activities based upon the Activity Program of the Overseas Public Relations Committee of JISEA for Fiscal Year 1985 (beginning April 1, 1985), as approved by JISEA.

Article II

The period of this agreement shall be from April 1, 1985 to March 31, 1986.

Article III

Retainer fee for IPR shall be US\$3,000 per month. JISEA shall remit that amount to IPR by the last day of each month during the effective period of this Agreement.

Article IV


Expenses resulting from activities based on this Agreement shall be reimbursed by JISEA separately to IPR as specified in the attached Memorandum.

JISEA and IPR agree that the below shall constitute the determination of retainer fee and related expenses with respect to the Agreement entered into by and between both parties on April 1, 1985.

1. Retainer Fee


2. Expenses

Expenses reimbursable by JISEA to IPR in connection with activities on behalf of JISEA shall be limited to those described herewith:


