



RETAINER AGREEMENT

WHEREAS, Hogan & Hartson has represented the Embassy of Japan, as its General Counsel in Washington, D.C., during prior fiscal years beginning on April 1 and terminating on March 31, and


WHEREAS, the parties have heretofore mutually agreed to a continuation of that legal relationship during the fiscal year beginning April 1, 1996, subject to annual renewal by mutual agreement of the parties;

THEREFORE, the parties agree that Hogan & Hartson will continue to provide legal services and advice to the Embassy of Japan for the period from April 1, 1996 through May 20, 1996. The term of this Agreement will be extended until March 31, 1997 when the Diet approves the budget of fiscal year 1996. Services hereunder shall be compensated through an annual retainer sum of \$36,000 (U.S.) billed quarterly in advance, plus actual disbursements billed at the conclusion of each quarter (\$6,000 for the first two months commencing April 1, 1996). It is understood that this retainer does not include legal services in connection with real estate matters and acquisitions or special matters requiring extraordinary legal time and attention.

The contract shall come into force as of the first day of April, 1996, and shall be in effect until March 31, 1997, on the condition that the FY 1996 budget will be approved by the Diet.

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
