



Dear Mr. Ambassador:

I am very pleased to submit this proposal, as you have suggested, under which I and my firm would serve as counsel to the United Arab Emirates.

Very generally, we would, as your counsel, be available for consultation with you and any other diplomatic representatives of the Emirates in connection with any matters in which you might desire our advice or guidance. I would contemplate that this would include counsel with respect to the United States legislative matters or executive policies which might affect the interests of the Emirates, as well as counsel with respect to commercial or other ventures with United States or foreign business interests under consideration by your Government.

We would suggest an annual retainer of \$25,000 against which our time for general consultation would be applied. If our time for such services were to exceed the \$25,000 retainer, we would bill you for the excess. Additionally, we would take appropriate measures to let you know in advance if it appeared that our consulting activities were going to cause the value of our services to exceed the amount of the retainer.

We would of course also be available to represent the Emirates in specific transactions. In such circumstances, we would open a separate account and bill you separately for our services.

I would be pleased to discuss this further with you, or with you and Foreign Minister al-Sowaidi when he is in the city next month.
