

The registrant has rendered and will render advice and representation to the foreign principal on U.S. laws, regulations and policies that may affect or relate to the activities and interests of the foreign principal, including international narcotics interdiction programs; joint U.S.-Bahamas drug enforcement activities; extradition treaties matters; bilateral aviation matters; Caribbean Basin Initiative matters; foreign investment and trade development in the Bahamas; regulation of drug offenses under state and federal laws; insurance requirements and state taxes applicable to Bahamas tourist offices in U.S.; and bilateral tax treaties. For such services, the foreign principal will pay the registrant a fee of \$75,000 quarterly, plus out-of-pocket expenses. The duration of this agreement is indefinite.


