

The Foreign Agents Registration Act defines "foreign principal" as, among other things, "a person outside the United States, unless it is established that such person is an individual and a citizen of and domiciled within the United States... ." Because ACCRL's membership consists primarily of American citizens residing and domiciled abroad, who are concerned with the implications of that status on the transmission and retention of U.S. citizenship, and possibly some foreign citizens with children who are U.S. citizens, all of its contributions come from "foreign principals" as defined in the Act.



Encouraging passage of legislation amending the Immigration and Nationality Act of 1952, as amended ("INA") so as to: eliminate the statutory conditions on retention of citizenship imposed by Section 301(b) of the INA (8 U.S.C. § 1401(b); eliminate or reduce the statutory requirements for the transmission of citizenship imposed by section 301(a)(7) provisions of the INA (8 U.S.C. § 1401(a)(7); and, eliminate or amend various other provisions of the INA which have been held unconstitutional or which are inconsistent with (i) and (ii) above. Specifically, we will encourage favorable and timely action on several bills that have been introduced this session: S. 2314, H.R. 9637 and H.R. 10323. The means employed will be communication with various members of Congress, their staff, and the staff of congressional committees. There is no present plan to seek support from the general public by disseminating information thereto.

Re: Representation of ACCRL in Washington
in Connection With Its Efforts to Amend
the Immigration and Nationality Act

Dear Mr. Sundberg:

We are prepared to represent ACCRL in connection with the above-entitled bills, including investigation, advice, and representation before Congress and appropriate administrative departments and agencies. Our firm will also be responsible for ACCRL compliance with the Lobbying Act and other laws applicable to its U.S. activities and will register under the Lobbying Act and the Foreign Agents Registration Act.


We will bill you for our services \$1,000 per month over the next five months (i.e. not to exceed \$5,000), which is based on our estimate of the time we will expend on this matter. In addition, related incidental expenses will be billed monthly, which will be no more than several hundred dollars a month unless for activities specifically authorized by ACCRL (i.e. unexpected trips, heavy reproduction and mailing costs). If there are hearings that require preparation of witnesses or our own testimony, we should be authorized to exceed the above amount by no more than \$3,000.

Dear Steuart,

Mr. Sundberg in Geneva has sent me copies of yours of 28th April regarding the ACCRL matter which, of course, you and I corresponded about earlier.

Mr. Sundberg feels, and I agree, that it is important to keep the pressure on regarding the proposed changes in the I&N Act and we also agree that your office is ideally situated to perform the necessary activities here.

Mr. Sundberg's present problem with ACCRL is that he has no funds to be able to guarantee payment of your fair and reasonable fees in this matter as outlined in yours of 28th April. His position in this regard may be better later this year but, as continued pressure is necessary now, please take the present as your authority to bill me personally in these ACCRL representation matters as outlined in yours of 28th April to Mr. Sundberg. Your office will, therefore, be covered until the end of the present Congressional session which, hopefully, should see this matter successfully terminated. Should these questions be carried over to the new session of Congress, Mr. Sundberg will then have to make new arrangements with you for ACCRL representation. I enclose a copy of mine of today to Mr. Sundberg in this regard so, hopefully, all parties are clear.

I do not know if the present would constitute a deductible expense if handled with you by our Virginia office with the net non-deductible difference being debited to me personally, but I am asking them, by means of a copy of the present, to control this question with your office and act accordingly.

Hoping this ACCRL matter will win the day this year for the benefit of the thousands of children involved, and awaiting your further news, I remain, with cordial regards as always,
