Central Bank of the Republic of Turkey

Registrant assisted the Republic of Turkey in its negotiations with the Executive Branch with respect to the bilateral treaty between the United States and the Republic of Turkey for the Reciprocal Encouragement and Protection of Investment. The assistance was in the form of legal advice in connection with negotiations, including the preparation of detailed analysis and draft texts, review of other U.S. investment agreements, analysis of ICSID, UNITRAL and other arbitration options, review and analysis of U.S. model treaty, and participation in meetings with USG and World Bank officials.

Registrant also assisted the Republic of Turkey in its negotiations with the Executive Branch with respect to the bilateral agreement between the United States Government and the Republic of Turkey in the implementation of Turkey's becoming a signatory to the Subsidies Code.
