

Dear Mr. Christophides:

In accord with our recent discussions concerning the need of the Government of Cyprus for representation in Washington, I am pleased to be able to confirm that O'Connor & Hannan will undertake that representation.

Pursuant to that representation, we will immediately undertake efforts to explain the compelling need of the people of Cyprus for reunification between their Greek and Turkish communities and solicit support among U.S. policymakers for complete unification of Cyprus under a single central government. More generally, we will seek to advance the interests of the Government of Cyprus, promote foreign investment in your country by U.S. concerns, and generally promote trade between our two countries.


This basic representation will be undertaken under an annual retainer of \$200,000 to be paid to O'Connor & Hannan in quarterly installments of \$50,000, payable in advance or before

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the 15th of January, April, July, and October. Expenses, which would normally be confined to postage, telephone, photocopying, telex, delivery, and similar incidental costs, will be billed separately on a quarterly basis. No extraordinary expenses will be incurred without prior approval of the Government of Cyprus.
