



Dear Mr. Figgis:

Hill & Knowlton, Inc. ("H&K") is delighted to have the opportunity to work with you and your organization. This letter will serve as a letter of agreement ("LOA") for a project pursuant to which H&K will provide communications services to Qatar Foundation ("Client"). The services to be provided under this Agreement include media support surrounding the QSTP U.S. Roadshow; including the following:

Work for the project will begin on January 19<sup>th</sup>, and is expected to be completed following Roadshow events at a time of Client's choosing.

The sum above does not include out-of-pocket expenses associated with the Roadshow outreach. Client will pay the net cost of all routine out-of-pocket disbursements, such as postage, courier, in-house photocopying, and ordinary communications (telephone, facsimile, and e-mail). Additional fees could include bulk materials development and news release wire distribution.

Client will reimburse H&K for the net cost of all reasonable travel and accommodation expenses undertaken on Client's behalf.

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Client will pay H&K the net cost of all materials, services and rights obtained by H&K from third-party suppliers on Client's behalf, plus a fifteen (15) percent handling and administration fee. In obtaining such materials, services and rights, H&K will act as agent for Client as disclosed principal. The use and cost of all third-party suppliers will be approved by Client prior to the expenses being incurred.

We agree to preserve the confidentiality of any proprietary or confidential information disclosed to us or developed by us for you.

In keeping with industry practice, we require that QSTP hold us harmless from any loss we may incur as a result of any materials or information which you supply to us, or from materials prepared by us or other communications efforts that are approved by you, except when directly attributable to our failure to use due care.

Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions, either party may cancel this contract by issuing written notification 10 days in advance.


