Short Form Registration Statement

Pursuant to the Foreign Agents Registration Act of 1938, as amended

INSTRUCTIONS. Each partner, officer, director, associate, employee, and agent of a registrant is required to file a short form registration statement unless he engages in no activities in furtherance of the interests of the registrant's foreign principal or unless the services he renders to the registrant are in a secretarial, clerical, or in a related or similar capacity. Compliance is accomplished by filing an electronic short form registration statement at <https://www.fara.gov>.

Privacy Act Statement. The filing of this document is required for the Foreign Agents Registration Act of 1938, as amended, 22 U.S.C. § 611 *et seq.*, for the purposes of registration under the Act and public disclosure. Provision of the information requested is mandatory, and failure to provide the information is subject to the penalty and enforcement provisions established in Section 8 of the Act. Every registration statement, short form registration statement, supplemental statement, exhibit, amendment, copy of informational materials or other document or information filed with the Attorney General under this Act is a public record open to public examination, inspection and copying during the posted business hours of the FARA Unit in Washington, DC. Statements are also available online at the FARA Unit's webpage: <https://www.fara.gov>. One copy of every such document, other than informational materials, is automatically provided to the Secretary of State pursuant to Section 6(b) of the Act, and copies of any and all documents are routinely made available to other agencies, departments and Congress pursuant to Section 6(c) of the Act. The Attorney General also transmits a semi-annual report to Congress on the administration of the Act which lists the names of all agents registered under the Act and the foreign principals they represent. 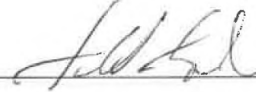

Appendix

Response to Item 11

Item 11: Describe in detail all services which you will render to the foreign principal listed in Item 10 either directly, or through the primary registrant listed in Item 8.

The President shall be the chief executive officer of KEI and, subject to the direction and control of the Board, shall perform all duties as chief executive officer of KEI and have general supervision and control of all of the business and affairs of KEI. The President shall be a member of the Board, shall preside at all meetings of the Board, and shall sign or cause to be signed all contracts, leases, or other instruments or documents which the Board has authorized to be executed, and which are necessary to carry out the objectives of KEI, except in cases where the signing and execution thereof shall be delegated by the Board, the Bylaws, or statute to some other officer or agent of the Institute.

The President occupies the leadership position of the organization. The President directly oversees the programs, publications, and personnel at KEI. The President sets the vision and overall direction of the Institute, guided by the KEI Board of Directors and the President of KIEP. Under the direction of the Board, the President oversees the business affairs of the Institute, presiding at all meetings of the Board of Directors. The role of the KEI President is high profile and requires representing the Institute at senior-level meetings and forums, serving as a frequent public speaker or moderator at major events, and consulting with senior government and non-government leaders on U.S.-Korea related issues. The President must be able to interact effectively with Korean counterparts in government and in the National Assembly and act as an effective intermediary with U. S. government officials, legislators, academics and a wide range of stakeholders. The President should be seen as a senior and well-respected member of the East Asian business or policy community, advocating for the economic interests and political/security concerns of the U.S.-ROK alliance.

The Foreign Principal Korea Institute for International Economic Policy is a research institute funded by the Republic of Korea government to conduct studies and analyses of global economic issues. Its aim is to help South Korea pursue a more effective international economic policy. KIEP assesses the implications of recent developments in the global economy for the government and carries out research in partnership with other institutions and organizations. The registrant's objective is to promote discussion on the economic relations and other bilateral issues between the Republic of Korea and the United States. Through its publications, programs, and public events, KEI seeks to advance scholarship and understanding of the Republic of Korea in ways that will inform policymakers and American public of the security, economic, and political implications of our connections to the Korean Peninsula.
