AGREEMENT

This Agreement is entered into by and between International Public Relations Co., Ltd. (hereinafter referred to as IPR) and Civic Service Incorporated (hereinafter referred to as CSI) for services to be provided by CSI for IPR in the United States.

ARTICLE 1. CSI agrees to provide counseling activities for IPR on matters relating to U.S. government policy and industry trend which impact on U.S.-Japan telecommunications business sectors.

ARTICLE 2. The period of this Agreement shall be for the twelve month period April 1, 1990 through March 31, 1991.

ARTICLE 3. Fee for Activities shall be US\$96,000, including expenses.

ARTICLE 4. IPR shall pay the amount of \$8,000 monthly at the end of each month as the monthly allotment for the preceding month. IPR shall remit by bank wire to the account of CSI at the First National Bank, 7707 Forsyth Boulevard, Clayton, Missouri 63105, Account Number 13-097-7.

ARTICLE 5. CSI shall take measures necessary to safeguard any and all confidential information and/or materials from third parties during the execution of Activities.

ARTICLE 6. In case decisions are required on matters not covered in this Agreement, such matters shall be handled and decisions made based on mutual agreement between CSI and IPR.
