

# UAE – U.S.

## Texas Trade Report | 2022



## Report Summary Points

---

**1**

**Texas** exported ~**\$16.1B** in goods to the UAE between 2018- '22 (ranked **1<sup>st</sup>** among U.S. states); year-on-year exports have trended up since '20 reaching ~**\$3.7B** in '22.

~**95%** of **Texas** exports to the UAE (~**\$3.7B**) in '22 was driven by its top 10 sectors; *Computer & Electronics Products, Transportation Equipment, and Machinery* sectors were key drivers.

**Texas** trade surplus with the UAE reached ~**\$2B** in '22 (ranked **1<sup>st</sup>** among U.S. states); this is a ~**12%** increase from '21.

**Texas**'s port-driven, bilateral economic trade activity with the UAE reached ~**\$4.2B** in '22 (ranking **3<sup>rd</sup>** among U.S. states and contributing **15%** to total U.S. port-driven trade activity).

**Texas-UAE** trade drove the creation of ~**30k jobs** in '22 (~**22%** of total jobs created and **1<sup>st</sup>** among U.S. states); *Computer/Electronics Products* and *Transportation Equipment* sectors were key drivers.

Exhibit 1: Exports to the UAE (\$ billions) | U.S. State Rankings | 2018 - 2022





Exhibit 2: Texas Exports to the UAE (\$ billions) | Year-on-Year Percent Change

Exhibit 6: U.S.–UAE Trade Surplus | Top 10 States | 2022





Exhibit 7: U.S.–UAE Trade Surplus | Year-on-Year Percent Change | Top 10 States | 2021 v 2022

Exhibit 8: Port Trade Bilateral Activity | Texas | U.S. to UAE exports has trended up since 2020





Exhibit 9: Port Activity Distribution | Share of Trade | Texas | 2022

Exhibit 10: Employment Map (Estimated # Jobs Created) | 2022 | \*Only depicting states with +4k jobs created






# UAE – U.S. Foreign Direct Investments | ALL U.S. STATES

UAE FDI into the U.S. has trended up since 2018 (except Pandemic year / 2020) to reach its highest level of ~\$38B in 2022 with 13.8% y-o-y growth.

While UAE FDI into the U.S. grew meaningfully between 2020-2022, its share of all Middle East FDI increased by 8 ppts. to reach 49%
