- **Jurema Werneck** – a physician and human rights leader, she highlights the intersection of racial equity, health, and climate justice.
- **Sineia do Vale** – an Indigenous leader from Roraima, she brings firsthand perspective on protecting the Amazon and integrating traditional knowledge into climate solutions.
- **Marina Grossi** – as head of the Brazilian Business Council for Sustainable Development (CEBDS), she has been instrumental in aligning business ambition with COP30's agenda.
- **Elba Gannoun** – a seasoned diplomat, she offers insight into Brazil's role in international negotiations and its approach to climate diplomacy.
