Over 70 countries met in Brasília this week for the Pre-COP 2025, marking a decisive moment on the road to Belém.

The message was clear: **COP30 Brazil** will be the COP of implementation – the one that turns ten years of progress since the Paris Agreement into the next decade of delivery.

A COP of Implementation

Parties reaffirmed Belém will mark the start of a new era focused on results. With the Paris Rulebook complete and the first Global Stocktake concluded, the world now turns to how those commitments will be implemented – through investment, transparency and inclusion on the ground.

Finance and Systems Integration

Negotiators advanced discussions on aligning climate and economic agendas, with progress on the Baku–Belém Roadmap toward the USD 1.3 trillion annual climate finance goal by 2035. The meeting highlighted innovative instruments, such as the Tropical Forests Forever Facility, and new country platforms that will channel capital directly into national transition plans, among other mechanisms.

Adaptation, Just Transition and People-Centered Action

Delegates agreed that climate action must be felt in people's lives – from farmers and workers to Indigenous communities. The Pre-COP advanced the debate on a Global Goal on Adaptation with measurable indicators and reaffirmed the need for tangible outcomes on the Just Transition Work Program.

Multilateralism and Momentum

The Pre-COP showed that countries are entering Belém committed to working together to find common ground to solve our collective challenges.

As COP30 President–Designate Ambassador André Corrêa do Lago emphasized, "This will be a COP where the world delivers – on implementation, on credibility, and on unity."

Next stop: Belém.

This week, the [COP30 Brazil](#) Circle of Finance Ministers, led by Minister Fernando Haddad, published its report on the Baku to Belém Roadmap to 1.3T after months of work.

The document addresses important issues in climate finance across five priorities:

- ✅ Scaling Up Concessional Finance and Optimizing Climate Funds;
- ✅ Reforming Multilateral Development Banks to Scale up Sustainable Finance;
- ✅ Boosting Domestic Capacity and Investment Frameworks for Climate Finance, including Country Platforms;
- ✅ Developing Scalable and Innovative Financial Solutions for Private Capital Mobilization;
- ✅ Strengthening Regulatory Approaches for Climate Finance

The collaborative effort of over 30 Finance Ministers reflects the imperative of reinforcing multilateralism, pushing the international financial architecture to function more coherently as a system, and advancing climate action in the renewed spirit mutirão in support of the Baku to Belém Roadmap, the COP30 Action Agenda and the implementation of the Paris Agreement.

The ministers wrote beautifully in their statement: "As the cost of inaction on climate change rises, it disproportionately exposes the world's most vulnerable populations — who have contributed least to historical emissions — to escalating climate risks, highlighting inequities embedded in climate change. Every year of delayed climate action raises both the investment needed and the risks faced."

The report will make a vital contribution to the Baku to Belém Roadmap, which we are co-authoring with the COP29 Azerbaijan Presidency and will publish in the coming weeks.

As we move from words to action, this work reminds us that the transformation of the global financial system is both urgent and possible — if we act together, with purpose and solidarity.

Adaptation has become the frontline of global climate action.

Earlier this week, a new [UN Climate Change](#) report confirmed a turning point: 144 countries have initiated their National Adaptation Plans, and 67 developing nations – including 23 least developed countries and 14 small island states – have now submitted them.

Together, they signal the urgency to accelerate the implementation of climate solutions that build resiliency for the future.

At this pivotal moment, the [COP30 Brazil](#) Presidency releases its 8th Letter to the International Community, dedicated to adaptation as the next step in human evolution.

COP30's President-Designate Ambassador André Corrêa do Lago calls on Parties to make Belém the COP of adaptation – where cooperation becomes the organizing principle of the global response.

He reminds us that adaptation is not a secondary issue, but a political and economic necessity: "Without adaptation, climate change becomes a poverty multiplier. Failure to act is not technical negligence - it is a political choice."

In Belém, adaptation will define negotiations priorities:

- Finalizing the assessment of NAP progress and next steps for countries still developing their plans.
- Advancing the Baku-Belém Adaptation Roadmap (BAR) to accelerate the Global Goal on Adaptation.
- Closing the adaptation finance gap through new mechanisms and partnerships.
- Delivering the UAE-Belém Work Program with concrete indicators on resilience, capacity and vulnerability reduction.

As the 8th Letter concludes, adaptation must now move from negotiation to demonstration, so Belém can be remembered as the COP of adaptation implementation.

Dear Friends,

In further advancing our Global Mutirão against climate change, the Brazilian incoming Presidency of the 39th session of the Conference of the Parties (COP30) to the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC) presents its eighth letter to the international community, this time dedicated to the vital theme of climate **adaptation**.

In this letter, I invite Parties and stakeholders to consider adaptation through new lenses: as the **next step in human evolution**.

As the age of warnings gives way to the age of consequences, humanity confronts a profound truth: climate adaptation is no longer a choice that follows mitigation; it is the first half of our survival. At each turning point in our evolution, our species has earned its place on this planet by adapting – learning, innovating and transforming the conditions of life itself. Adaptation has demanded the courage to let go of what no longer serves us while preserving what defines us.

Today, this evolutionary truth returns with renewed urgency. Evolutionary biology confirms what wisdom has long known: survival has never belonged merely to the strongest, but to the most cooperative – those capable of nurturing symbiotic relationships that sustain life in balance. Cooperation has been the essence of our humanity in natural selection.

As President Lula says, COP30 will be the COP of truth, where we are tested on our capacity to set differences aside and confront the climate crisis as the existential threat it is. Cooperation must again emerge as the organizing principle of the global response. Our ability to implement the adaptation provisions of the UNFCCC and the Paris Agreement through enhanced **international cooperation** will determine whether we evolve not only to survive, but to become the best version of humanity – grounded in dignity, justice and solidarity.

From the Convention's ultimate objective to the Paris Agreement's long-term resilience goal, from the Global Goal on Adaptation (GGA) to National Adaptation Plans (NAPs), COP30 must be the COP of adaptation. Adaptation ambition and action will be key to advancing in Belém our three priorities: (i) strengthening **multilateralism**; (ii) connecting the climate regime to **people's** daily lives; and (iii) accelerating climate **implementation**.

Ten years after the adoption of the Paris Agreement, the 2025 [UN Climate Change Synthesis Report on Nationally Determined Contributions \(NDCs\)](#) shows a shared recognition that the next decade must mark a decisive new era of accelerated implementation.

Through the analyzes 64 new NDCs, the report finds that 89% of countries now include economy-wide targets, with most aligning their NDCs to long-term net-zero strategies. Collectively, the new NDCs are projected to cut emissions 17% below 2019 levels by 2035 – evidence of accelerating ambition, though still short of the trajectory needed to limit global temperature rise to 1.5°C. Collectively, UNFCCC data projects new NDCs could reduce emissions 10% below 2019 levels by 2035.

For [COP30 Brazil](#) President-Designate André Corrêa do Lago, "Countries now see their NDCs not as isolated pledges, but as development instruments linking climate ambition to adaptation, finance, technology, and inclusion.

This report reminds us that implementation, solidarity, and international cooperation are foundational to moving forward, faster and realizing a better, safer and more prosperous future.

COP30 CEO [Ana Toni](#) added: "We welcome the enhanced NDCs that respond to the Global Stocktake and urge Parties yet to submit their updated NDCs to do so. This will be critical for making COP30 the stage of a decisive moment in the history of multilateralism."

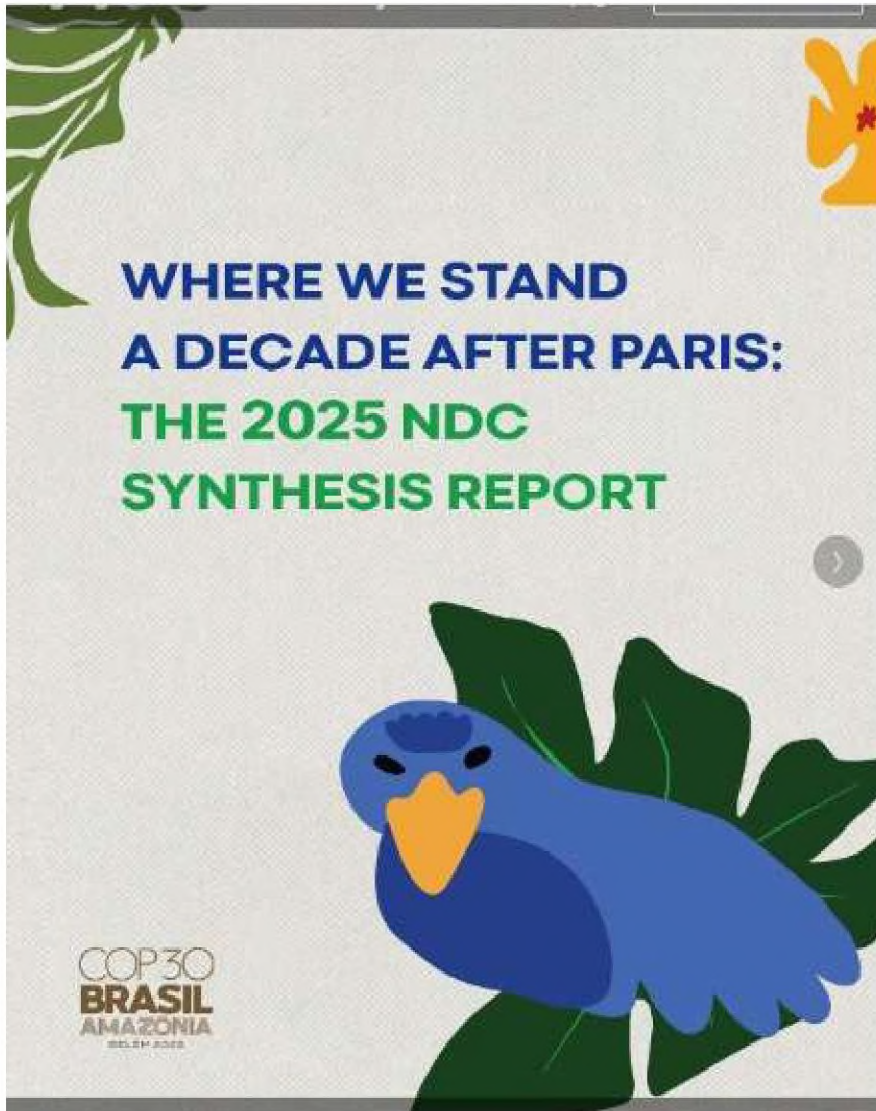
At COP30 in Belém, the focus is on accelerating implementation by:

- Reinforcing multilateralism – uniting all Parties and stakeholders under one shared purpose: rebuilding trust and strengthening the Paris Agreement as the foundation for collective climate action.
- Accelerating implementation everywhere – aligning the Action Agenda with the Negotiations Track to ensure that commitments lead to measurable progress across mitigation, adaptation, finance, and inclusion.
- Connecting climate action to real lives – through the Granary of Solutions and the Global Mutirão for Implementation, turning global goals into jobs, resilience, and opportunities that improve people's daily lives.

No one should assume that climate change is a problem for the future.

Around 3.6 billion people already live in areas highly susceptible to climate change. Every year, 20 million people are displaced by extreme weather events such as floods, droughts, and heatwaves. The least developed countries are 10% poorer today than they would have been without climate change.

Between 2030 and 2050, climate change is expected to cause approximately 250,000 additional deaths per year from undernutrition, malaria, diarrhea, and heat stress alone.

Adapting is not only imperative for our survival but also the essence of sustainable development in a climate-changing world, as the COP30 President Designate, André Corrêa do Lago, wrote in his eighth letter to the international community last week. This is why we are committed to turning [COP30 Brazil](#) into a turning point for adaptation.

Earlier this month, [Systemiq Ltd.](#), in collaboration with over 20 partners, launched a report showing that investments in adaptation deliver four times more benefits than costs, with an average annual return rate of 25%.

Other interesting findings include:

- ✓ Investments in adaptation can generate over 280 million jobs across emerging markets and developing economies by 2035;
- ✓ By 2030, the market for adaptation and resilience could reach up to \$1.3 trillion annually;
- ✓ In some vulnerable economies, adaptation could increase GDP by up to 15% by 2050, while strengthening fiscal stability and reducing debt risk.

The #COP30 Leaders' Summit opened today in Belém with a powerful reminder from President [Luiz Inácio Lula da Silva](#) that this moment marks a symbolic return of the global climate convention to its birthplace three decades after the Earth Summit in Rio.

Now hosted in the heart of the Amazon, [COP30 Brazil](#) stands as both a homecoming and a call to action for a planet at a crossroads.

President Lula warned that the world's window of opportunity for action is closing rapidly, underscoring that 2025 will be a defining year for multilateralism, marking the 80th anniversary of the United Nations and ten years since the Paris Agreement.

He urged leaders to treat this milestone not as a commemoration, but as a reckoning: "COP30 will be the COP of truth".

At the heart of his message was the Brazilian notion of *Mutirão*, a spirit of collective effort and solidarity that should guide the work in Belém. This shared purpose, he said, can bridge divides, inspire cooperation and drive progress where it is most needed.

✅ Tropical Forests Forever Facility (#TFFF)

Fifty-three countries endorsed the Facility, with 19 potential investors signaling early interest. Announced contributions included US\$3 billion from Norway, US\$1 billion each from Brazil and Indonesia, €500 million from France, US\$5 million from the Netherlands for the Facility's secretariat, and €1 million from Portugal.

✅ Call to Action on Integrated Fire Management and Wildfire Resilience

Endorsed by over 40 countries and organizations such as FAO, UNEP and the International Tropical Timber Organization, the Fire Declaration establishes integrated fire management as a global priority for climate adaptation, biodiversity protection and sustainable land stewardship.

It calls for a shift from reactive fire suppression to prevention-based, inclusive and science-driven strategies that unite modern technology with Indigenous and traditional knowledge –strengthening cooperation, empowering local communities and embedding long-term resilience into initiatives like the TFFF.

From Belém to Baku, the message is clear: the path to 1.5°C depends on unity, courage and action. The Global *Mutirão* has begun.

On its second day, the **COP30 Brazil** Leaders' Summit in Belém showcased how global climate action is being translated into real solutions, scaling up efforts to end hunger, strengthen resilience, expand sustainable fuels, and advance credible carbon markets.

Across every announcement, the message was clear: climate action must work for people, protect ecosystems, and deliver impact where it's needed most.

From hunger to clean energy, from resilience to inclusion, implementation is already taking shape in Belém:

The Belém Declaration on Hunger, Poverty and Human-Centered Climate Action: 44 countries endorsed the new Declaration, outlining concrete steps to tackle hunger and poverty through climate solutions. It commits to expanding climate-responsive social protection systems, investing in resilient food production, and empowering small-scale farmers and local communities to manage climate risks. The Declaration also calls for inclusive finance and just transition measures to ensure that climate action delivers tangible benefits for those most affected by a warming world.

Adaptation as a Strategic Investment: Leaders Call for More Urgency to Accelerate Resilience

At the Roundtable on Implementation of Adaptation Goals, Co-hosted by Brazil and the United Nations and held during the Belém Leaders' Summit on November 7, global leaders reaffirmed that adaptation is an urgent and strategic investment for communities, developing and developed countries. By protecting livelihoods, infrastructure, and food systems, adaptation strengthens fiscal stability and accelerates sustainable development. Many participants stressed that the cost of inaction is much higher than the cost of action and that investing in adaptation is a good investment for all.

The Belém 4X Pledge on Sustainable Fuels

19 countries endorsed the Belém 4X Pledge, a commitment to strengthen international cooperation and accelerate the global shift to sustainable fuels. The goal is to increase the use of sustainable fuels at least fourfold by 2035, advancing cleaner transport, energy security and low-carbon growth.

The Declaration on the Open Coalition on Compliance Carbon Markets

Endorsed by Brazil, China, the EU, UK, Canada, Chile, Germany, Mexico, Armenia, Zambia, and France, and open to more signatories, the Declaration underscores the growing role of compliance carbon markets in driving decarbonization and helping countries meet climate goals.

✓ **Belem Declaration on Fighting Environmental Racism**

Adopted today, the Declaration calls for global dialogue on racial equality, climate, and the environment, reinforcing social justice and human rights in climate policy. Open for endorsement during COP, it's already backed by countries across Latin America, Africa, Asia, and Oceania.

From Belem to Baku, the Global Mutirão continues.

Ahead of #COP30 in Belém, the Special Envoys for Strategic Regions, representing Africa, the Middle East, Latin America and the Caribbean, Europe, North America, South Asia, and Oceania, have issued a joint Letter to Leaders in Belém, expressing strong support for the Brazilian Presidency and all leaders committed to advancing climate action.

The Envoys call for unity and concrete action to bridge the “triple gap” in mitigation, adaptation, and finance, and emphasize the need to implement the Paris Agreement and the UAE Consensus through policies and investments focused on the Global South, ensuring that progress is both inclusive and equitable.

“It is the moment to remind ourselves of the need for solidarity, and to recognize our agency – we have it within our power to change the future for the better.”

Their letter is a united call to:

- Close the “triple gap”: mitigation, adaptation, finance
- Mobilize \$1.3 trillion annually for the Global South
- Triple global renewable energy capacity and accelerate the transition from fossil fuels
- Advance roadmaps to end deforestation and restore ecosystems
- Empower subnational leaders and local action
- Strengthen resilience and adaptation through smarter finance and risk protection
- Confront climate disinformation head-on

The statement underscores that collective will, credible action, and multilateral cooperation remain the most powerful tools to confront the climate crisis.

COP30 Day 1 Recap: Elevating Adaptation by Unleashing the Power of Technology

COP30 Brazil opened today in Belém with a powerful display of solidarity and commitment, launching a new era of global climate action defined by implementation, inclusion, and innovation.

Parties swiftly adopted the official COP30 agenda, a convincing show of consensus that reaffirmed trust in multilateralism and the collective will to accelerate the Paris Agreement. The early adoption, alongside the election of Ambassador André Corrêa do Lago as COP30 President, set the tone for a COP focused on delivery and turning commitments into real outcomes for people and planet.

Technology at the Heart of Action

- Launch of the Green Digital Action Hub and the AI Climate Institute, supporting developing countries with tools and training to design their own digital climate solutions.
- The Nature's Intelligence Studio, co-led by Oxford University, INPA, and CAF, introduced the Amazon as a hub for nature-inspired innovation.

Breakthroughs in Agriculture and Resilience

- At the Agricultural Innovation Showcase, new commitments were announced to advance agricultural innovation and climate-resilient food systems, including USD 1.45 billion from the [Gates Foundation](#) to expand access to innovations that help farmers across sub-Saharan Africa and South Asia adapt to extreme weather and USD 30 million raised by the Global Methane Hub to cut methane emissions from rice cultivation.
- Launch of the first open-source AI model for agriculture, set to empower 100 million farmers by 2028 with real-time tools for adaptation and resilience.

Finance for Adaptation and Equity

- The Fund for Responding to Loss and Damage (FRLD) issued its first USD 250 million funding call, marking its full and rapid operationalization.
- Multilateral Development Banks announced USD 26 billion in adaptation investment and introduced new frameworks for tracking nature finance.
- The Belém Declaration on Hunger and Poverty, announced and endorsed by 44 countries last week, launched a new Climate-Resilient Social Protection and Smallholder Agriculture Finance Partnership.

✔ Global Action and Inclusion

- The Race to Resilience Campaign reported 437 million people now live with greater climate resilience – supported by USD 4.18 billion in finance and protection for 18 million hectares of ecosystems.
- The COP30 Green Zone officially opened, bringing together civil society, innovators, businesses, youth and other stakeholders to connect and accelerate climate action.
- Youth climate champion [Mikaelle Farias](#) highlighted that this COP marks the largest youth participation in the past three years, a milestone for inclusion.

Day 1 closed with optimism and urgency. By elevating adaptation and unleashing technology, COP30 is demonstrating that the world can transform vulnerability into strength and ambition into action.

COP30 Day 2 Recap

Day 2 of COP30 in Belém showcased how local and subnational leadership is driving real-world climate progress - in people's homes, cities, and communities.

The Beat the Heat Implementation Drive, co-led by the COP30 Presidency and UNEP's Cool Coalition, officially moved from planning to delivery, mobilizing finance and partnerships to protect 3.5 billion people in 185 cities from extreme heat through sustainable cooling and green infrastructure.

At the High-Level Ministerial on Urbanization and Climate Change, the Plan to Accelerate Multilevel Governance (PAS) was launched alongside the operationalization of CHAMP – the Coalition for High Ambition Multilevel Partnerships. Brazil and Germany were announced as co-chairs, steering efforts to embed multilevel governance in 100 NDCs by 2028, train 6,000 local officials, and expand access to climate finance.

The Buildings Breakthrough Initiative introduced global standards for Near-Zero and Resilient Buildings (NZERB), while the No Organic Waste (NOW) Plan committed USD 30 million to cut 30% of methane emissions from organic waste by 2030, integrate 1 million waste workers, and recover 20 million tonnes of food annually.

Water and climate resilience was also elevated as a core adaptation priority. The Latin America and Caribbean Water Investment Programme, led by ECLAC and CAF, announced a USD 20 billion pipeline for water security by 2030, while the "Waters of Change" Ministerial adopted a Joint Statement on Water and Climate Action, reaffirming water as a cornerstone of adaptation and sustainable development.

The day concluded with the Global Mutirão Ministerial Plenary, uniting ministers and mayors from over 80 countries to reaffirm that the future of the Paris Agreement is being built from the ground up.

✅ COP30 opened its innovative Action Agenda Thematic Spaces, reflecting the axes of the Global Stocktake across six zones hosting events over two weeks. More than 400 international initiatives and 100 Plans to Accelerate Solutions will be showcased, embodying the COP of implementation.

✅ Yearbook of Global Climate Action 2025: Published by [UN Climate Change](#) and the [Climate High-Level Champions](#), the report highlights progress and gaps, showing how global action is moving from ambition to delivery.

✔ **Circular Economy and Innovation:** The NOW Plan will cut methane emissions by 30% by 2030, recover 20 million tonnes of food, feed 50 million people, and integrate 1 million waste workers into the circular economy.

✔ **Digital Inclusion and Global Mobilization:** The Maloca platform, developed by UNDP and the COP30 Presidency, expanded virtual access to COP30. The Mutirão for E-Waste Management, organized by Brazil's Ministry of Communications, collected 1,000 tonnes of e-waste, trained 2,700 youth, and donated 100 refurbished computers to community centers.

Day 2 closed with a clear message: implementation begins where people live.

COP30 Day 3 Recap: Empowering and Equipping People to Accelerate Progress

Day 3 at COP30 was defined by action and optimism – a reaffirmation that people, skills, and cultural heritage are at the heart of the climate transition.

The launch of the Global Initiative on Jobs & Skills for the New Economy set a powerful tone, uniting governments, industries, and civil society to show how climate action can be a source of shared prosperity, with the potential to create over 650 million jobs in the coming decade.

Empowerment also took shape through inclusivity. The Indigenous Adaptation event elevated ancestral knowledge and local governance as essential tools for national and global resilience, with new commitments to finance Indigenous-led projects directly. Indigenous leaders from across regions shared best practices and adaptation models, showing how ancestral knowledge can guide national and climate policies.

COP30 platformed information integrity for the first time as part of the action agenda. With six new member states joining the Global Initiative on Information Integrity on Climate Change, the day showed that fighting disinformation is central to empowering people with truth and protecting the integrity of collective climate action.

Collaboration across public and private sectors was another defining theme in a day dedicated to empowering people.

Global Initiative on Jobs & Skills: launched to integrate jobs and skills into economic and climate strategies, showing that the transition could generate 375 million new jobs and 280 million adaptation jobs. Eight countries have already joined the Action Plan.

Information Integrity for Climate Action: expanded with six new member states and ten funded projects, launching a Declaration on Information Integrity and a Dialogue Roundtable through COP31. **UNESCO's** Global Fund will support implementation in the Global South.

Sustainable Public Procurement: the Belém Declaration, launched with **UNIDO** and **IDD**, commits countries to use procurement to promote low-carbon materials, fair labor, and inclusive action.

Culture and Storytelling: the event Narratives and Storytelling to Face the Climate Crisis launched a plan to integrate cultural heritage into adaptation plans, featuring Margareth Menezes, Janja Lula da Silva, Claudia Roth, Davi Kopenawa, Kumi Naidoo, and others.

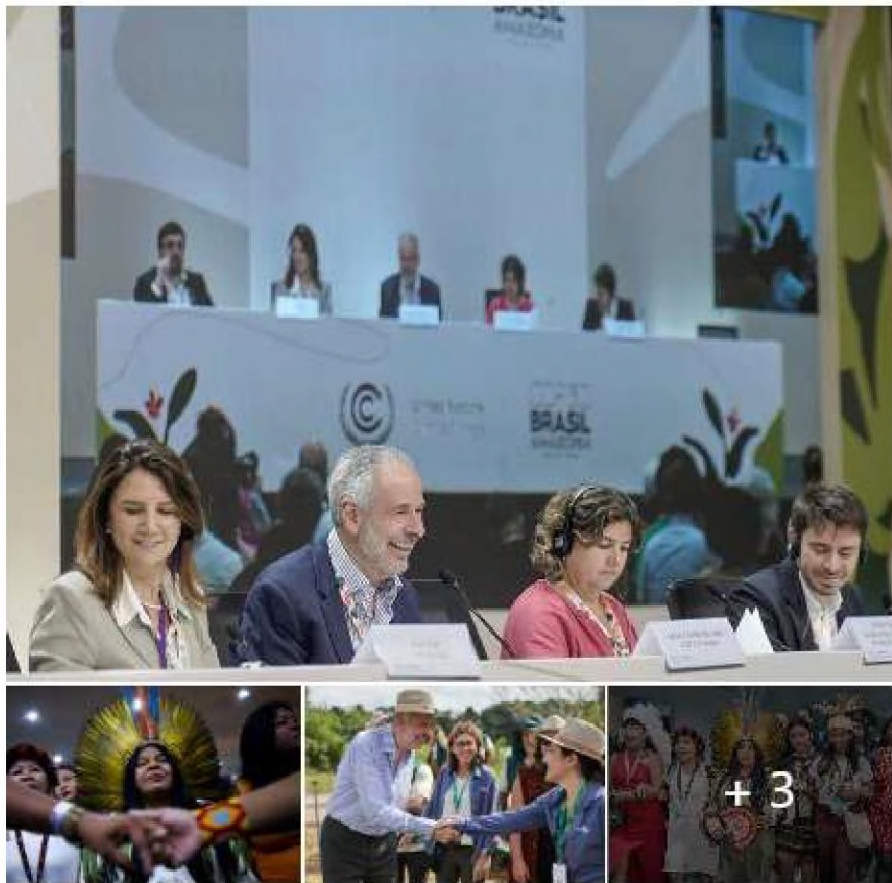

COP30 Day 4 Recap: Health and Education at the Heart of Climate Adaptation

Day 4 at COP30 placed human well-being at the center of climate action.

The Belém Health Action Plan (BHAP), the first international climate adaptation framework dedicated specifically to health, was officially launched today at COP30. Led by the Government of Brazil in partnership with [World Health Organization](#), the plan has already received 80 endorsements and an initial USD 300 million investment from the Climate and Health Funders Coalition to support its implementation.

Justice and human rights continued to feature throughout the day, including the first ever “Justice Day” at a COP. The event brought judges and magistrates from around the world where Min. Marina Silva stressed that ethics and justice are inseparable from climate action.

Financing remained a unifying thread across sectors. The launch of the Fostering Investible National Planning and Implementation (FINI) initiative aims to turn adaptation plans into investible projects, targeting USD 1 trillion in adaptation pipelines by 2028. The Debt-for-Resilience Joint Initiative launched by IDB, CAF and CDB will help Caribbean nations ease debt pressures and strengthen preparedness, while the CREWS Strategy 2030 mobilized new funding from European partners for early-warning systems.

In the Green Zone, COP30 Youth Climate Champion [Marcele Oliveira](#) promoted vaccination and public health as pillars of climate resilience.

Across discussions, a message resonated: health, education, and justice are foundational to elevating adaptation and improving lives.

- Belém Health Action Plan (BHAP): adopted under Brazil’s leadership with WHO, endorsed by 30 countries and 50 partner organizations, and backed by USD 300 million from global philanthropies to build climate-resilient health systems.
- Greening Education Partnership: co-hosted by Brazil and UNESCO, launched the Greening Education Partnership’s knowledge products, training programme and global dashboard
- Day of Justice and Human Rights: adoption of the Belém Declaration of Judges on Climate Change, promoting ethics, law, and accountability in climate governance.
- FINI and Climate Finance: USD 1 trillion adaptation project pipeline by 2028, linking adaptation plans with large-scale investment and private-sector engagement.
- Early Warning Systems and Debt-for-Resilience: new funding and frameworks to improve disaster preparedness and reduce financial vulnerability.

Day 4 concluded reaffirming that protecting lives, promoting justice, and empowering learning are the cornerstones of a resilient future.

As COP30 enters Day 6 in Belém, finance takes centre stage as the engine of implementation – unlocking catalytic capital, aligning global markets with climate ambition, and supporting the countries and communities that need it most. Today highlights how trade, finance, and governance come together to power a fair, resilient, and people-centred transition.

The morning opens with the Integrated Forum on Climate Change and Trade, aligning economic systems with climate ambition and underscoring the need for financial and trade reforms that enable an open, supportive international system. Simultaneously, a session on advancing taxonomy interoperability will show how harmonized sustainable finance frameworks can unlock cross-border capital, particularly for emerging markets.

Brazil and the Green Climate Fund will announce new Country Platforms for climate and nature finance and launch a South–South Knowledge Hub to strengthen investment planning, technical cooperation, and peer learning. In the afternoon, the Open Coalition on Compliance Carbon Markets and the Baku to Belém Roadmap to 1.3T will focus on mobilizing the climate finance scale to deliver climate solutions, turning recommendations into actionable pathways.

 COP30 Day 6 Recap: Building the Financial and Ethical Foundations for a Just Transition

Day 6 at COP30 underscored that a fairer and faster climate transition depends on aligning financial systems, ethical frameworks, and global cooperation.

Finance took center stage with today's events focusing on deploying catalytic capital, improving mechanisms, and progressing pathways including a productive event advancing the \$1.3 trillion outlined in the Baku to Belém Roadmap.

The launch of the Principles for Taxonomy Interoperability advanced global alignment of sustainable finance standards. Asset owners representing \$10T engaged with MDBs, investors, business and governments to identify actions and present recommendations including for hard-to-abate sectors and emerging economies.

Brazil and the Green Climate Fund announced new Country Platforms and launched a Country Platform Hub, strengthening coordinated planning and financing pathways for climate and nature.

Momentum grew behind solidarity levies, with more countries joining the Premium Flyers Solidarity Coalition and new research confirming the revenue potential of fair, non-debt instruments for adaptation and loss-and-damage.

Advancing Solidarity Levies

- Countries expand the Premium Flyers Solidarity Coalition.
- New technical report shows strong revenue potential across high-emitting, undertaxed sectors.
- Levies reaffirm the polluter-pays principle for adaptation, resilience, and loss-and-damage finance.

- Discussions center on concessional finance, domestic frameworks, financial instruments, and regulation.

- The new Platform Hub connects nations to technical assistance, knowledge, and funding partners.
- Platforms align with the COP30 Finance Ministers' Circle recommendations.

- 60 leaders including 30 major asset owners met this week to discuss recommendations for unlocking climate capital presented today focused on emerging markets.
- Event included proposal to establish a standing Asset Owner Summit at COP.

- Launch of the Principles for Taxonomy Interoperability and the Sustainable Finance Taxonomy Mapper.
- Tools improve comparability across jurisdictions and support a common language for climate finance.

✔ Open Coalition on Compliance Carbon Markets

- Coalition grows to 18 endorsing countries.
- Focus on cooperation for MRV systems, high-integrity offsets, and transparent governance.

Day 6 closes with more financial coherence, ethical alignment, and collective action to shape the foundations of a just and implementable transition.

🌐 COP30 Week 1 Recap: Accelerating Implementation, Improving Lives

First week of [COP30 Brazil](#) showed the world what implementation looks like in practice.

From fuels to finance, education to energy, major announcements have advanced implementation — from \$5.5 billion in funding for the Tropical Forest Forever Facility (TFFF) to the 4X Sustainable Fuels Pledge, to Belém Health Action Plan and concrete steps to scale adaptation and resilience.

Week 1 began with a strong opening statement in support of multilateralism through the Day 1 adoption of the agenda. Each day after reinforced that we have the solutions and collective spirit needed to tackle the climate crisis.

✅ Week 1 began by elevating adaptation and technology, with the launch of the Green Digital Action Hub, the AI Climate Institute and the first funding million call from the FRLD. New commitments for climate-resilient agriculture, including the first open-source AI model for farmers, highlighted how innovation strengthens resilience.

✅ Local and subnational leadership took center stage with major advances on multilevel governance, the launch of its Plan to Accelerate Action (PAS) and the operationalization of CHAMP. New global standards for resilient buildings, initiatives to cut methane from organic waste, and large-scale water security investments underscored that implementation is happening at all levels.

✅ People empowerment defined the following day, with the Global Initiative on Jobs & Skills, breakthroughs on information integrity and new commitments to Indigenous-led adaptation. Cultural heritage, youth participation and community leadership were recognized as essential pillars of a just transition.

✅ Health, education and justice anchored Day 4, with the launch of the Belém Health Action Plan, new adaptation finance platforms and the first-ever Justice Day at a COP. The message was clear: protecting lives, strengthening rights and expanding learning are central to accelerating climate resilience.

✅ Energy, industry and finance drove Day 5, with milestones for the Belém 4X Pledge, the Future Fuels Action Plan, global grid expansion and green industrialization. Collaboration and investment are reshaping the foundations of sustainable growth.

✅ Day 6 highlighted that a fair transition depends on aligned financial systems and global cooperation. Work to advance the Baku to Belém Roadmap progressed to unlock USD 1.3 trillion annually. New Country Platforms and a Platform Hub will support coordinated climate planning. An initiative on solidarity

levies gained supporters, and the first Asset Owners Summit aligned on recommendations to better allocate capital to areas of need. In Belém, thousands marched to reaffirm that people remain at the heart of climate action.

COP30 Day 8: Nature at the Center of Climate Action

Week 2 opens with a unifying focus: placing nature, forests, oceans, biodiversity, and the rights of Indigenous Peoples, local communities, children, youth, and small entrepreneurs at the heart of global climate action.

After a first week marked by more than 30 major announcements – from the USD 5.5 billion Tropical Forest Forever Facility and the Belém Declaration on Hunger, Poverty, and Human-Centered Climate Action to the 4X Sustainable Fuels Pledge and concrete advances on adaptation –, COP30 has delivered concrete steps to scale accelerate implementation.

Today, leaders will reinforce that protecting nature and empowering frontline communities are essential pillars of climate action.

High-level dialogues will advance forest finance building on the TFFF, while contributor governments mobilize behind the Adaptation Fund to meet the needs of vulnerable countries.

The launch of the Bioeconomy Challenge will translate G20 principles into practical pathways for a global sociobioeconomy, and a USD 1.8 billion land-tenure pledge will move from political announcement to concrete signing. The day wraps with further progress on Methane reduction through the Global Methane Pledge Ministerial.

Sessions throughout the day spotlight the leadership of Indigenous and Afro-descendant Peoples, the power of youth mobilization, and the urgency of tackling methane emissions.

Youth on Action Agenda

Youth organizations map priorities and co-design pathways for deeper engagement, followed by "From Listening to Action" at the Children and Youth Pavilion led by Youth Climate Champion Marcelle Oliveira with Zé Gotinha and Curupira.

Unlocking Forest Finance

High-level dialogue building on the TFFF to launch and connect forest finance initiatives toward a roadmap for reversing deforestation.

Adaptation Fund Contributor Dialogue

Contributor governments announce new pledges toward the Fund's USD 300M 2025 target, unlocking over USD 1B in project proposals for vulnerable nations.

The Bioeconomy Challenge

Launch of a multistakeholder platform to turn G20 Bioeconomy Principles into action through metrics, finance instruments, and sociobioeconomy markets.

Indigenous and Community Land Tenure Ceremony

Signing of two commitments to secure land rights and advance the promises made by Heads of State during the World Leaders Summit.

✅ Indigenous Peoples and Local Communities Leadership

Roundtable on governance lessons for funds like TFFF, including the 20% IPLC Dedicated Finance Allocation.

✅ Global Methane Pledge Ministerial

159 countries and the EU launch the first Global Methane Status Report and set the implementation pathway to 2030.

As Week 2 begins, COP30 underscores that real climate action starts with nature – and with the people who protect it.

COP30 Day 8 Recap: Nature at the Center of Climate Action

Day 8 of COP30 focused on putting nature at the center of climate action to drive real progress for people, economies, and the planet.

The day marked a decisive shift from pledges to practice, with countries, communities, Indigenous leaders, and civil society partners advancing tools, unlocking finance, and elevating community leadership to accelerate implementation and reinforce multilateral cooperation.

A major milestone was the operationalization of the Tropical Forest Forever Facility, the largest forest-finance mechanism ever created, signaling that standing forests are central to a resilient future.

Progress on land tenure also accelerated as donors surpassed the USD 1.7B IPLC Pledge ahead of schedule and 14 countries endorsed the first Intergovernmental Land Tenure Commitment, strengthening rights across 160 million hectares.

Nature-positive momentum continued with the launch of the Bioeconomy Challenge, the new Scaling JREDD+ Coalition, the Global Fire Management Hub, and Brazil's Earth Investment Engine, which surpassed USD 10B mobilized for nature-based solutions.

Youth leadership and Indigenous governance shaped dialogues across COP30, reinforcing that safeguarding nature is inseparable from safeguarding cultures, rights, and territories.

✔ Unlocking Financing for Tropical Forests and Indigenous Stewardship

TFFF operationalized as the world's largest forest-finance facility, anchored in long-term incentives and a 20% allocation for IPLCs.

✔ Finance & Land Tenure Advancements

Donors exceeded the USD 1.7B Pledge and renewed support through 2030. Fourteen countries endorsed the first global land-tenure commitment.

✔ Adaptation Fund Receives Millions in New Contributions

New pledges advanced the New Collective Quantified Goal and unlocked over USD 1B in proposals for vulnerable countries.

✔ Bioeconomy and Regenerative Landscapes

The Bioeconomy Challenge launched to operationalize G20 principles. Investments in regenerative landscapes surpassed USD 9B across 210M hectares and 12M farmers.

✔ Scaling JREDD+ and Fire Management

The new coalition aims to raise USD 3–6B/year by 2030. The Global Fire Management Hub will expand early warning and resilience across 10M+ hectares.

✔ Methane Pledge: Pathways Forward

The Global Methane Status Report 2025 highlighted the potential for the largest

methane decline in history if national plans are fully implemented.

Day 8 closes highlighting that nature is the foundation of implementation, and empowering frontline communities is indispensable to building a just, resilient, and sustainable future.

As COP30 enters Day 9, the climate community comes together around a unified vision: protecting the world's vital ecosystems; from oceans and coastal zones to forests and the biodiversity that sustains life and livelihoods.

Today builds the momentum for the structural shifts needed to safeguard nature while advancing resilience for people on the frontlines of climate impacts.

The morning opens with two high-level ministerials anchoring this narrative. Delivering Ocean Commitments will highlight global progress on the Blue NDC Challenge and demonstrate how ocean-based climate solutions are becoming central to national planning and implementation of the First Global Stocktake.

The launch of the NAP Implementation Alliance will strengthen collaboration on national adaptation priorities, while the Global Ethical Stocktake will underscore the importance of fairness, shared responsibility, and ethical governance as cornerstones of climate decision-making.

Day 9 demonstrated how cross-sector action for oceans, forests, biodiversity, Indigenous Peoples, youth, and SMEs is accelerating real-world implementation. Countries and partners accelerated action to protect vital ecosystems and strengthen resilience for people on the frontlines of climate impacts.

Today, 17 countries joined the Blue NDC Challenge while the One Ocean Partnership launched a global network of regenerative seascapes to mobilize \$20 billion for a Regenerative Blue Economy. New accountability tools strengthened transparency across marine conservation, renewable energy, aquatic food, shipping, and coastal tourism.

The launch of the Global Ethical Stocktake Report reinforced justice, ethics, and cultural as crucial pillars of credible implementation, while Children and Youth Day elevated community-driven adaptation, territorial governance, and renewable energy access. At the People's Circle, Indigenous, quilombola, coastal women, and youth highlighted how environmental justice and territorial protection remain central to climate resilience.

SME-driven innovation supported by the Climate-Proofing SMEs Campaign and the South-South Collective for Climate.

✅ Advancing Ocean Conservation

17 countries joined the Blue NDC Challenge; The One Ocean Partnership launched regenerative seascape network to mobilize \$20B; new tools are helping improve ocean accountability; mangrove, peatland, and saltmarsh breakthroughs mobilize finance to support the blue economy.

✅ Small Businesses Are at the Heart of the Green Economy

Climate-Proofing SMEs Campaign supported ~90M SMEs; 250+ companies strengthened supply chain decarbonization; S2C2 committed to supporting 5,000+ startups and mobilizing USD 220M by 2027.

✅ Launch of the Global Ethical Stocktake Report

Launched the first GES Global Report, progressing ethical reflection through multi-sector dialogue to advance Paris Agreement implementation.

✅ Promoting Synergies Across the Three Conventions

Rio Convention Presidencies advanced coordinated action across climate, biodiversity, and land agendas.

✅ Building for Forests Acceleration Plan

15 governments and 300+ industry partners united to scale responsible timber use and forest-positive construction.

✅ Launch of the NAP Implementation Alliance

New platform aligning finance, technical assistance, and investment behind national adaptation initiatives.

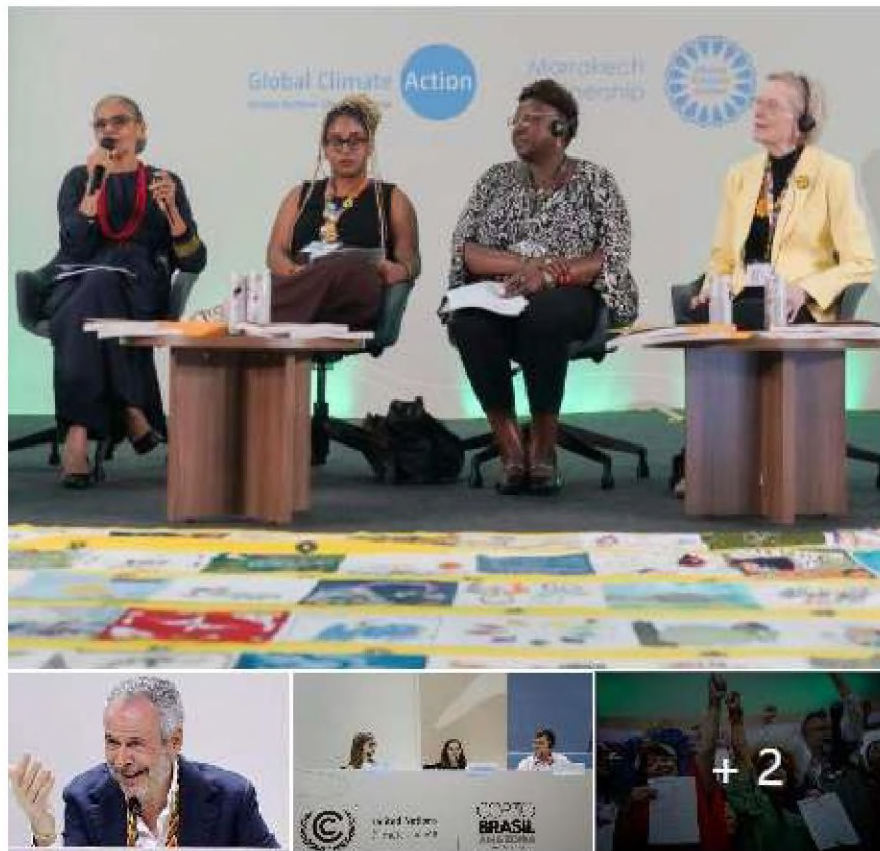

 COP30 Day 10: Fueling the Future Food System

Day 10 at COP30 brings global attention to transforming agriculture, food systems, and supporting the communities most affected by the climate crisis. Today's discussions highlight how restoring land, elevating women's leadership, and scaling practical, science-based solutions can translate climate ambition into tangible improvements for farmers, families, and frontline communities.

The morning begins by hearing directly from women who confront climate impacts daily and create solutions that guide our collective future. Brazil also advances its Protocol for Women and Girls in Climate Emergencies, reaffirming that gender equality is essential to resilience and community protection.


At the High-Level Ministerial on Agriculture, the urgent challenge of land degradation takes center stage with the launch of the RAIZ Initiative, introduced as a COP30 legacy to restore degraded farmland and embed sustainability across global food systems. International partners will build on this momentum through new investments and tools for climate-resilient agriculture, including the CCAC Agriculture Flagship, the Fertilizer Call to Action, and Germany's new IM-PACT support for the FAST Partnership.

Throughout the afternoon, global partners will present new financial and technological pathways to scale resilient agri-food systems, while dialogues on gender and climate emergencies deepen the call for inclusive governance.

The day concludes with the Global Climate Action High-Level Event details many of the significant outcomes and progress from the work of the Action Agenda to scale solutions, and issuing a collective call for a *mutirão* to turn commitments into measurable progress.
