



INTERNATIONAL DEVELOPMENT SYSTEMS INC.

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PROPOSAL

March 26, 1992

This is a proposal setting forth the terms and conditions for an agreement between the Government of Sri Lanka (hereinafter "GOSL"), and International Development Systems, Inc. (hereinafter "IDS"). The objective of this proposal is to assist the GOSL in the planning, development, and operation of an efficient export management system for Sri Lankan textile and apparel exports to the United States.

IDS, within the terms of this agreement, will provide the necessary assistance for the evaluation, design, programming and documentation, installation, integration of U.S. data, and the final review and modifications that may be necessary to ensure that accurate and timely data is available to the GOSL and the trade. The availability of this data will be most helpful in assuring the optimum advantages for Sri Lanka's textile and apparel textile exports to the United States. To complete this project, IDS envisions six separate, but integrated, steps to final completion. These steps are as follows:

Step One: Review of Existing System

In this phase, IDS would work with the GOSL authorities, the GCEC, and the Industry to fully outline the goals in obtaining an efficient export management system and to identify those elements that are already in place in Sri Lanka for the allocation, authorization, and monitoring of the textile and apparel trade. This would include, not only the current trade documents, but also the Government documents required for the

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importation and exportation of textile and apparel products. It is estimated that this would take approximately three (3) days in Colombo after which IDS would prepare a full report containing the recommendations to move towards the final system, including the outline of basic trade documents that would be required.

Step Two: Complete System Design, Document, and Work Schedule

In this phase, IDS would prepare and submit a complete system design document outlining the specific data elements required; the input routines; the basic report functions; and, any proposed changes to the existing system. Also included in this phase would be an estimate of the hardware required, and a schedule for completion of the remaining steps including IDS assistance to the GOSL in obtaining the U.S. namesake data on a computer diskette.

IDS preliminary thoughts are that the GOSL should consider having hardware to operate three stations. IDS estimates that these three stations (computer, modem, phone line, and printer) can be purchased for less than \$9,700.

This design document will present a detailed outline of how the new system will meet the goals identified in Step One. This will include sample reports as well as specific recommendations for modifications to existing import/export documentation.

Step Three: Software Preparation

In this phase, IDS would write, test, and document the software needed to compile and process the system inputs in order to produce the required, and desired, outputs.

Step Two and Step Three should be completed, including the preparation of operating manuals, within thirty (30) days.

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Step Four: Installation of Software and Training Key Personnel

In this phase, IDS would ensure the proper installation of all software and assist in the training of key personnel that would be operating the system both in Colombo and in the Sri Lankan Embassy in Washington, D.C. This phase should take no more than (3) days in Colombo and since we anticipate working closely with the Sri Lankan Embassy during this full project, no more than one (1) full day in Washington.

Step Five: Integration of U.S. Namesake Data and Reporting System

As soon as Sri Lanka succeeds in obtaining monthly namesake data on a computer diskette, IDS will, in this phase, integrate the input of the U.S. namesake data with Sri Lanka's data so that closer monitoring and comparison of these data can be made. This is a critical phase in the entire project as it will allow for the quick identification of data discrepancies either in Sri Lanka or the United States which can be addressed prior to these discrepancies creating "quota crises".

Step Six: Review of Initial Goals and Application of any Modifications Needed to the System

In this phase, IDS will work with Colombo and the Sri Lankan Embassy in Washington, D.C. to review the functioning of the inputs, processing, and validity of output. At this stage, minor modifications may be necessary to input routines or the report functions in order to make them more helpful and usable for decisions affecting the textile and apparel trade in Sri Lanka. Although this process will continue throughout the operation of the system, IDS would anticipate a close monitoring of the system for at least four (4) months. During these four months, we will be able to evaluate the effectiveness of the system, suggest minor modifications to the system, and ensure that it is in good working order.

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IDS proposes that the term of this agreement be for six (6) months beginning April 1, 1992 and extending through September 30, 1992. The first four steps would ideally be completed by June 1, 1992 so that the system would be as ready as possible for the start of what may be the new quota year. This would then allow for four (4) months of reviewing the operation of the system and installing any modifications that may be required.

Professional fees to be paid to IDS for providing the assistance and services under this agreement will be US\$40,000 to be paid in two (2) equal payments of \$20,000 each. The first of which shall be due and payable on execution of this agreement. The second payment would be due and payable four (4) months following the start of Step One.

IDS will be reimbursed for all out-of-pocket expenses including local transportation, travel, and living expenses outside Washington, D.C. area, telephone, telex, copying and delivery charges, secretarial overtime, and other expenses excluding normal overhead expenditures. Expenses shall be itemized, billed, and payable monthly. No major expenses, such as overseas travel, will be undertaken unless it is specifically agreed to by the GOSL.

The above terms are accepted to the GOSL, please sign and date two (2) copies of this agreement, returning one (1) copy to IDS and retaining one (1) copy for your records.
