
The Embassy of Japan, 2520 Massachusetts Avenue, N.W., Washington, D.C. 20008 (hereinafter referred to as the "Embassy"), and Paul H. DeLaney, Jr., 1920 N Street, N.W., Suite 610, Washington, D.C. 20036 (hereinafter referred to as "DeLaney"), have agreed as follows:

1. DeLaney agrees to provide the Embassy with a report on the rice issue, particularly regarding the Section 301 petition filed to the USTR by the Rice Millers' Association (RMA) with regard to Japan's rice import policy by December 31, 1988. The report shall include the specific items of reference described in the attachment hereto.
2. The Embassy agrees to pay DeLaney US \$20,000 (Twenty Thousand Dollars) upon receipt of the report.
3. The contents of the report shall be the property of the Japanese government. DeLaney shall not disclose them to any third party without the expressed permission of the Japanese government.

In witness of the above agreement, Minister Issei Nomura, representing the Embassy of Japan, and Mr. Paul H. DeLaney, Jr. have signed hereunder.
