KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS, that CASSIDY AND ASSOCIATES, INC., a corporation duly organized under the laws of the District of Columbia, and whose principal place of business is 655 15th Street, N.W., Suite 1100, Washington, D.C. 20005, does contract with AMERIBROM, INC., whose principal office is 52 Vanderbilt Avenue, New York, New York 10017, to provide consultant services for the period of six and one-half (6½) months, in consideration for the payment of fees per month, plus expenses, as follows:

- o April 15, 1991 through April 30, 1991, Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000)
- o May 1, 1991 through October 31, 1991, ^{Eight} ~~Five~~ Thousand Dollars (~~\$5~~,000) per month

Payment shall be made to CASSIDY AND ASSOCIATES, INC. in seven (7) advance payments, commencing on April 15, 1991, to follow on the first day of the next six (6) months, to end on October 31, 1991.

A statement of expenses shall be made to AMERIBROM, INC. by CASSIDY AND ASSOCIATES, INC. at the end of each month for expenses incurred during the previous month. The statement shall be made payable monthly. Federally appropriated funds may not be used to pay for any services provided or expenses incurred under this contract.

All fees to CASSIDY AND ASSOCIATES, INC. for services will be due and payable on the dates specified herein. All balances not paid on the due dates specified herein will bear interest at the rate of one percent (1%) per month until paid. All costs of collection incurred by CASSIDY AND ASSOCIATES, INC. of fees which are more than sixty days past due shall be paid by AMERIBROM, INC. promptly upon demand.

In its capacity as a consultant, CASSIDY AND ASSOCIATES, INC. shall make its best effort to assist AMERIBROM, INC. in pursuing

its business, government affairs, and public relations objectives. The nature of these objectives shall be determined by AMERIBROM, INC. with the advice and assistance of CASSIDY AND ASSOCIATES, INC.

In this role, CASSIDY & ASSOCIATES, INC. shall assist the AMERIBROM, INC. in its long-range planning for organizational and institutional development, in establishing priorities among its objectives, in developing and implementing strategic plans, and in expanding its government, corporate, foundation, and private outreach activities.

CASSIDY AND ASSOCIATES, INC., with the cooperation of AMERIBROM, INC., will conduct an extensive inventory of AMERIBROM, INC.'s resources; develop the concept for agreed-upon initiatives, create a theme for these initiatives; formulate a comprehensive plan and timetable for the initiatives; prepare the outline of a proposal for the initiatives; assist in the preparation of supporting documentation for the initiatives; create, where appropriate, a public relations strategy for presenting the initiatives' proposal; where appropriate, develop meetings with Members of Congress; prepare testimony for presentation before all relevant committees of the Congress; develop legislative strategies concerning the initiatives; serve as liaison to government agencies as necessary; and monitor and report on government programs relevant to the initiatives and other possible areas of interest to AMERIBROM, INC.

Neither party shall assign any of its rights or delegate any of its duties or obligations under this Agreement without the express written consent of the other party.
