This form shall be filed in triplicate for each foreign principal named in the registration statement and must be signed by or on behalf of the registrant.

Privacy Act Statement. Every registration statement, short form registration statement, supplemental statement, exhibit, amendment, dissemination report, copy of political propaganda or other document or information filed with the Attorney General under this act is a public record open to public examination, inspection and copying during the posted business hours of the Registration Unit in Washington, DC. One copy is automatically provided to the Secretary of State pursuant to Section 6(b) of the Act, and copies of such documents are routinely made available to other agencies, departments and Congress pursuant to Section 6(c) of the Act. Finally, the Attorney General transmits an annual report to the Congress on the Administration of the Act which lists the names of all agents and the nature, sources and content of the political propaganda disseminated or distributed by them. This report is available to the public.

Public reporting burden for this collection of information is estimated to average .33 hours per response, including the time for reviewing instructions, searching existing data sources, gathering and maintaining the data needed, and completing and reviewing the collection of information. Predecessor of RGIT was the Washington office of the German American Chamber of Commerce, Inc., established in 1976. Operations developed without specific written instructions and are continued this way under the joint supervision of the two new principals. The function of RGIT is to contribute to the exchange of information between the U.S.A. and the Federal Republic of Germany on behalf of German business in reflecting views of BDI and DIHT. Addressees are the public and the U.S. Government in particular. The duration of this understanding is not limited in time. Operating expenses and salaries are covered by the principals.

4. Describe fully the nature and method of performance of the above indicated agreement or understanding.
RGIT reports - generally in writing - to its principals on U.S. rules and legislation and major economic developments of relevance to U.S.-German trade and investment. RGIT also informs the U.S. public and government about German business and views of German business on economic, legislative and administrative action of mutual concern.

5. Describe fully the activities the registrant engages in or proposes to engage in on behalf of the above foreign principal. Activities include meetings with U.S. business, participation in conferences, oral testimony and written submissions to the U.S. Government, distribution of documents and press releases, appointments for visitors from Germany - and mirror activities in the Federal Republic of Germany.

The primary objective of the office is to inform U.S. contacts, primarily U.S. industry, about activities and views of German business. The U.S. Government occasionally is approached on issues concerning international trade or investment, e. g. non-tariff barriers, avoidance of double taxation, import restrictions, policies on foreign investment, export promotion or controls and the like. While the individual issues change, the policy is to contribute to maintaining an open international trade and investment climate. This is done through personal conversation with or submission of written materials to members or committees of Congress, federal regulatory agencies or executive branch officials.
