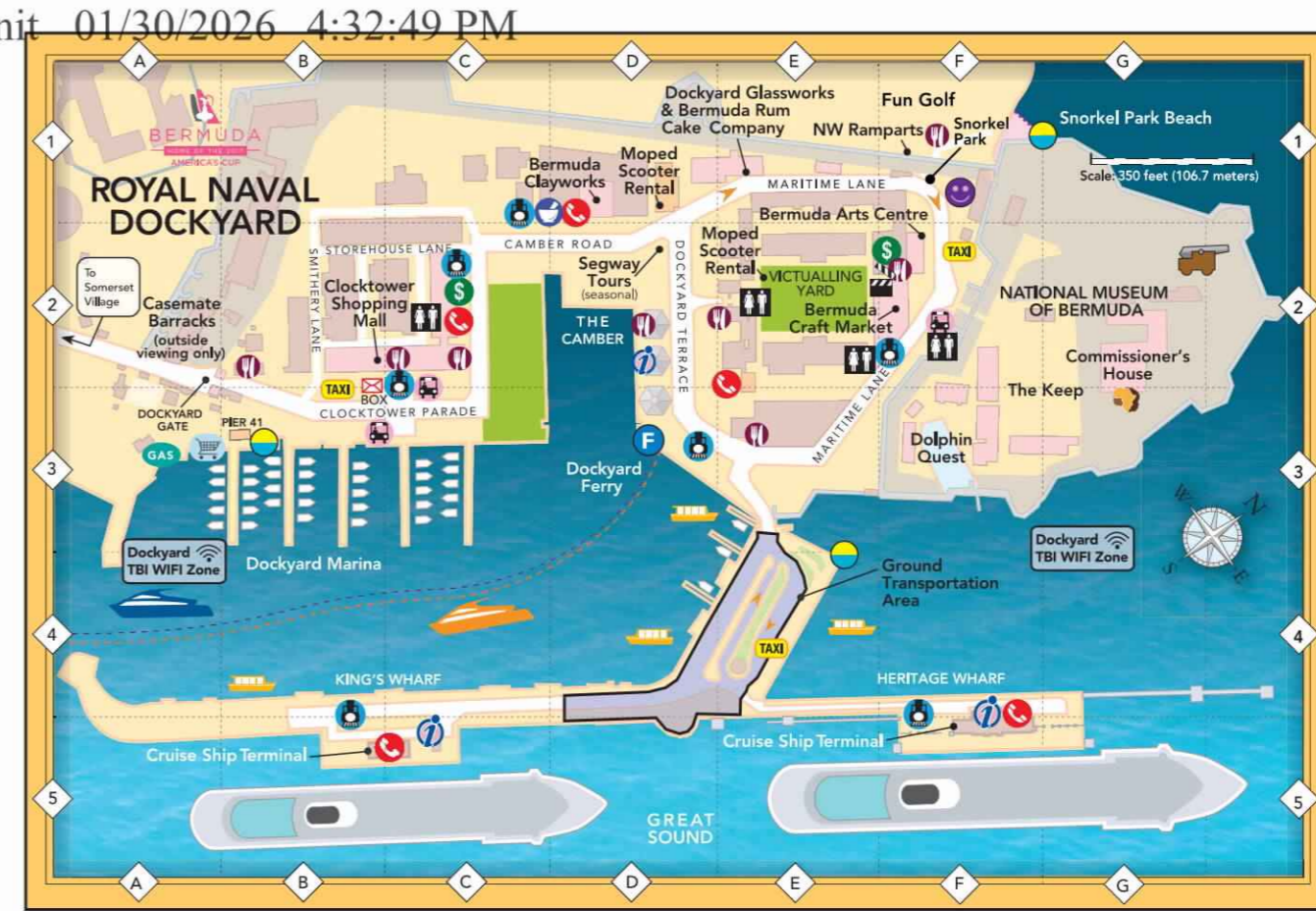
Map of the eastern part of Bermuda showing various locations, roads, and landmarks. Includes a grid from A to G and 1 to 5.

Key landmarks include: Dundonald Street, Victoria Street, Church Street, Reid Street, Front Street, City Hall & Arts Centre, Bermuda Monetary Authority, Wesley Methodist Church, St. Andrew's Church, Fire Department, Post Office, Sessions House Supreme Court, H.M. Customs, and the Ferry Terminal.

Town of St. George
The historic town of St. George and related fortifications is a World Heritage Site designated by the United Nations Educational, Scientific & Cultural Organisation (UNESCO) in recognition of their "outstanding universal value".

St. George's Parish
Key sites include: St. George's Harbour, St. David's Island, St. George's Church, and the Ferry Reach.

Flatts Village
Key sites include: Bermuda Aquarium, Museum & Zoo, and the Flatts Bridge.

Somerset Village
Key sites include: Somerset Long Bay East, Somerset Long Bay, and the Somerset Bridge.

Other locations: Hamilton Parish, Pembroke Parish, Devonshire Parish, Paget Parish, Warwick Parish, and Southampton Parish.

Key Locations and Landmarks:

- National Museum of Bermuda & Dolphin Quest:** Fascinating exhibits, spectacular views and dolphin encounters inside Bermuda's largest fort, the 19th century Dockyard Keep.
- Home of the America's Cup Village:** Located near the Royal Naval Dockyard.
- Royal Naval Cemetery:** Burial ground for the British Navy dating back to the 1700s.
- Somerset Long Bay East:** Freshwater pond with interpretive trail is a hot spot for migratory birds.
- Black Watch Well:** Dug by the Black Watch Regiment during the drought of 1849.
- Fort Hamilton:** Mid-19th century fort and moat.
- Arboretum:** 20 acres of open space, trees and shrubs.
- Bermuda Aquarium, Museum & Zoo:** See Flatts Village map for more information.
- Tom Moore's Jungle:** Historic specimens of the Calabash tree made famous by poet Tom Moore 1804.
- St. David's Lighthouse:** Built of Bermuda stone and has been lighting the way since 1879.
- Spittal Pond Nature Reserve:** Bermuda's largest wildlife sanctuary and Jeffrey's Hole.
- Portuguese Rock:** 1543 memento of an earlier visit.
- 'Vermont':** 18th century historic home filled with antiques.
- Old Devonshire Church:** Built 1716 and still lit by candlelight.
- Bermuda Underwater Exploration Inst.:** Interactive museum exploring the wonders of the ocean; great for all ages.
- Waterville:** c1725 historic home and headquarters of the Bermuda National Trust.
- Botanical Gardens:** Ornamental, horticultural and historical interest with Visitor's Centre.
- Camden:** Official residence of Bermuda's Premier.
- Masterworks Museum of Bermuda Art:** Features Bermuda inspired art, gift shop and cafe.
- Railway Trail:** A walking, jogging and sightseeing route island wide. Motor vehicles prohibited.
- Paget Marsh:** One of the last remnants of Bermuda's natural heritage, with board walk and interpretive signs.
- Sherwin Nature Reserve:** Second largest bird sanctuary with interpretive nature trail.

Town of St. George
UNESCO World Heritage Site

Key Landmarks: Fort St. Catherine & Museum, Tobacco Bay, St. George's Church, St. Peter's Church, and the 400th Anniversary Monument.

Other features: St. George's Harbour, King's Square, and various streets like Duke of York Street and Broad Alley.
