



on intentions on cooperation between the Council

Having discussed possibilities of cooperation in the field

P R O T O C O L

on intentions on scientific and technical cooperation

Ufa Council of People's Deputies and Mr. Donald Hansen a citizen of the USA (Seattle, Washington) who are named herein as Parties to this Agreement, consider the solution of the problems caused by ecological situation of the City Of Ufa to be of the highest priority.

1. During mutual consultations and negotiations , the Parties defined a list of cooperation activities.

2. To solve the ecological questions, the Parties have agreed to exchange with groups of specialists.

3. In case of necessity the Parties will make their contracts through international institutions in accordance with the Legislation of both countries.

4. The Parties cooperation will be regulated by the Legislation of both countries. In the establishment of technical cooperation, the Parties will adhere to the norms and regulations of those participating in the work.

5. The Parties interact in assessing the present ecological situation in Ufa using highly qualified american specialists and the most advanced technologies.

6. An important aspect of the Program of cooperation includes monitoring and development of a mathematical model of toxic dispersion in various media (water, air, soil) taking into account the geological structure of the locality and wind direction.

7. The citizen of the USA Mr. Donald Hansen is entrusted to represent the interests of the City of Ufa in contacts with International institutions, Social funds and industrial enterprises.

Mr. Hansen takes an obligation on him to provide consultations in the sphere of marketing and business in Ufa and to be a representative of the City of Ufa in this sphere in the USA and other countries.

8. Mr. Hansen will render assistance in purchasing specialized devices for analysing toxics (especially dioxines) and arranging for training and installation of these devices in Ufa. Mr. Hansen will provide the most up-to-date information on toxic substances

to assist the Soviet laboratory program.

9. The Parties consider that it is possible to build a Joint Venture with the aim of solving Ufa's ecological problems. The technological part of cooperation includes:

- utilization of liquid and solid chlororganic wastes;
- utilization of sludge and biological treatment facilities wastes;
- utilization of oil slam;
- gas wastes, industrial liquid wastes and other wastes cleanup technology;
- industrial refining of common wastes.

The participants: Ufa Council of People's Deputies, scientific and production enterprise "Energy", Mr. Donald Hansen.

10. American Party will use its best efforts to find financings for the remediation work from international institutions and social funds money.

11. All of the above-mentioned obligations of Mr. Hansen will be performed on the basis of terms, conditions and fees to be negotiated separately between the Parties.

12. The Parties consider the beginning cooperation as an important part of international cooperation in reconstituting the ecological health and welfare of Ufa.

13. This protocol comes into force from the day of signing and it remains in force till one of the Parties stop it 30 days after it declares its willing to refuse to take part in the cooperation.

This protocol may be changed and added to according to the Parties agreement.

The protocol is signed in Ufa on November 30, 1990 in three copies in Russian and in English, both texts have equal force.
