

Privacy Act Statement. 

This letter is the only evidence of the agreement between the registrant, Campos Communication, Inc. and the Secretaria de Comercio y Fomento Industrial ("SECOFI"). The parties will shortly be signing a formal, written contract, at which time we will make a supplemental filing to send a copy of the written contract. The basic terms of the representation involve a payment by SECOFI to the registrant of \$20,000 per month for an as yet undetermined amount of time in exchange for the registrant providing public relations activities relating to the proposed Free Trade Agreement.
