

Privacy Act Statement. 4. Describe fully the nature and method of performance of the above indicated agreement or understanding.

McDermott is Washington counsel to the EIAJ with respect to intellectual property matters pertaining to semiconductors. McDermott's responsibilities are primarily with respect to the interests of U.S. subsidiary companies of EIAJ members. However, legislation with respect to Section 914 of the Semiconductor Chip Protection Act of 1984 is judged to be primarily in the interest of the EIAJ member parent companies.

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5. Describe fully the activities the registrant engages in or proposes to engage in on behalf of the above foreign principal.

The registrant closely monitors developments in intellectual property law and monitors developments in related areas with respect to semiconductors. To the extent U.S. subsidiary companies of EIAJ members may be affected by intellectual property law developments, registrant consults with industry and government representatives as to the U.S. subsidiary intellectual property interest involved. With respect only to the Semiconductor Chip Protection Act of 1984, Registrant proposes to communicate with congressional and executive branch representatives as to the legislative interest of the foreign EIAJ member parent companies.

6. Will the activities on behalf of the above foreign principal include political activities as defined in Section 1(o) of the Act?¹

The registrant will communicate with officials of the United States Government with respect to passage of legislation extending beyond July 1, 1991, the authority of the Secretary of Commerce, under Section 914 of the Semiconductor Chip Protection Act of 1984, to issue Orders providing registration rights to nationals and domiciliaries of foreign countries, including Japan. Registrant may also communicate as to extension of Japan's existing Order pursuant to such extended authority, and with respect to issuance of a Presidential Proclamation in favor of Japanese nationals and domiciliaries under Section 902 of the Act.

¹Political activity as defined in Section 1(o) of the Act means the dissemination of political propaganda and any other activity which the person engaging therein believes will, or which he intends to, prevail upon, indoctrinate, convert, induce, persuade, or in any other way influence any agency or official of the Government of the United States or any section of the public within the United States with reference to formulating, adopting, or changing the domestic or foreign policies of the United States or with reference to the political or public interests, policies, or relations of a government of a foreign country or a foreign political party.

CONTRACT FOR PROFESSIONAL SERVICES

This agreement is made between the Electronic Industries Association of Japan (EIAJ) and McDermottt, Will & Emery (MWE), a law firm, for the provision of professional services pertaining to intellectual property and related technological developments in the United States or under U.S. law, as they pertain to semiconductors or the semiconductor industry, for the period April 1, 1991 through March 31, 1992.

Examples of matters within the contemplation of this agreement are: (1) Proceedings pursuant to the Semiconductor Chip Protection Act of 1984, and related matters such as negotiations involving WIPO and/or the U.S. Semiconductor Industry Association; (2) inquiries as to the operation of the patent or other intellectual property protection systems in Japan; (3) matters pertaining to legislation or regulatory activity as to high technology or competitiveness, such as those with respect to High Volume Electronics and High Resolution Imaging Systems in the U.S., and (4) matters pertaining to Intellectual Property and the GATT Uruguay Round, as the above matters might affect or pertain to the interests of U.S. subsidiaries of Japan-based semiconductor manufacturers.

A. Services to be Provided

Pursuant to this Agreement it shall be the responsibility of MWE, primarily through the efforts of Robert S. Schwartz, a partner thereof, to:

1. Advise concerning the interests of member companies of EIAJ;
2. Work to advance the interests of U.S. subsidiaries of member companies;
3. Participate in administrative proceedings, as directed, on behalf of the interests of U.S. subsidiaries of member companies of EIAJ; and
4. Perform such other services on behalf of EIAJ members and their U.S. subsidiaries as reasonably directed.

B. Compensation

MWE shall be compensated by EIAJ for the performance of such services at the customary hourly rate for the services of Mr. Schwartz (presently \$225 per hour) and other members or employees of MWE, plus reasonable expenses as incurred. It is anticipated that over the course of this contract, compensation to MWE will be approximately \$50,000. This approximation shall be a guide to MWE in performing services and incurring disbursements. In the event it appears to EIAJ or MWE that, due to necessary tasks or constraints, some requested adjustment shall be necessary or advisable in this respect, MWE and EIAJ will consult as to any possible agreement to revise this guiding approximation. On a monthly basis MWE will furnish to EIAJ an invoice, including a statement of hours expended and expenses incurred.

C. Termination

This agreement is terminable at will by EIAJ, for any reason. Upon notice of termination MWE will submit an invoice

of charges for hours and expenses accrued but not yet paid.
