



Re: FMC Corporation

Dear Israel:

I have now had the opportunity to consider your fee structuring request. We could act for Euromet, Amlon Metals and Wath Recycling in a lawsuit to be brought against FMC Corporation in the United States on the following basis:

1. For all legal work through the completion of discovery, you will pay a flat rate of \$265 per hour for all work by partners and associates and the actual hourly rates in effect at the time for all work by paralegals. The flat rate is subject to renegotiation if there is a firmwide increase in billing rates, which generally occurs in the beginning of the year. All work performed after the completion of discovery will be paid at the hourly rates in effect at the time the work is performed.
2. If the case results in a recovery of \$1,000,000 or more or for the benefit of one or more of the companies which we will represent you and/or they will pay an additional sum aggregating the lesser of \$100,000 or the difference between what our billings would have been at our regular hourly rates and the amounts that you have paid for fees pursuant to this agreement.
3. All billings for both fees and disbursements will be paid within 30 days of receipt. If there are any questions, they will be paid and resolved during that 30-day period. Given this fee structure, prompt payment must be a sine qua non and a failure thereof would warrant our prompt withdrawal from the matter without objection on your part or that of the companies. We will look to


you (in addition to the companies) for payment. You personally guarantee payment of the billings.

If these terms are acceptable, please indicate your agreement and your guarantee of payment by signing a copy of this letter in the space provided below and returning it to me. If they are not, please give me a call and we can discuss them.

Bob Zastrow advises me that we do not have a set of the papers filed with the English court. We understand, however, that there were many written statements taken from witnesses on both sides of the case. It would speed our work greatly if we could have a set of these materials as soon as possible.

We look forward to working with you on this matter.
