Thank you for your call on Friday.

In response to your request for a proposal concerning activities in conjunction with a National Press Club "Morning Newsmaker," please review the following.

In order to maximize the media attendance at the Newsmaker and coverage of the speaker's remarks, it is critical that a targeted effort be undertaken to contact important, individual media. Therefore, we propose the following activities:

- Develop a fact sheet on the speaker, summarize major speaking points, emphasize unique opportunity and reiterate who, what, when and where.
- Develop list of Washington-based national and international media covering related topics and issues, including politics, bilateral trade issues, etc.). Place alert on AP, UPI & Reuters Wire.
- Mail fact sheet to media list.
- 4. Follow up fact sheet with personal telephone calls beginning one week prior to event. Make a second round of calls on the day before the event. Target key reporters and important publications.
- Oversee distribution of statement and other materials on the day of the event to those media not attending.
- 6. Attend Newsmaker and work with media.
- Follow up with personal telephone calls to the media receiving the materials but not attending the Newsmaker.

We propose to assign an account executive to these activities who will work under my supervision.

Based on an hourly account executive billing rate of \$35.00 and based on a fee-time estimate of 30 hours, we propose a budget of \$1050.00.

In addition, we propose an expense budget of \$200 for postage, photocopying, messenger service, etc.

Total Media Budget......\$1250.00

In addition, we propose to edit the speaker's remarks and other media materials to be presented at the Newsmakers. Our fee for speech writing and text editing is \$100.00 per hour. Based this hourly speech writing/editing fee and based on a fee-time estimate of 10 hours, we propose a budget of \$1000.00.

Total Editorial Budget......\$1000.00

Total Project Budget.....\$2250.00

As you know, we have worked with several Korean organizations in past years, including the Korea Foreign Trade Association (KFTA) and The Korean Society for the Advancement of the Machine Industry (KOSAMI) and have drafted speeches for the chairman of both of these organizations. In addition, I have traveled to Korea on four separate occasions and have implemented media programs in Seoul for U.S. multi-national corporations and on behalf of a foreign government. I am very familiar with the bilateral trade issues between the U.S. and Korea and familiar with the country's political situation.

Please let me know if I can provide any additional information. We look forward to working with you on this important project.
