Agreement for the Provision of Services

Between

The Government of the Republic of Angola

And

Samuels International Associates, Inc.

A. Services

Samuels International Associates, Inc. (SIA) and the Government of the Republic of Angola agree that SIA will perform services for the Government of the Republic of Angola as mutually agreed by both parties.

Services may include the following or others as mutually agreed:

- Providing assistance to individual Angola diplomats, including facilitating arrangements for additional English language training
- Assisting in the flow of open source information to facilitate Angola's public image
- Facilitating interactions with agencies of the U.S. Administration and the U.S. Congress
- Facilitating U.S.-Angolan military-to-military relations
- Encouraging Angolan government relations with international NGOs
- Assisting in the preparation for Angolan participation in commercial events and visits
- Facilitating planning for Angolan VIP visits
- Providing briefings for Angolan diplomats and visitors on agreed topics
- Encouraging relations with U.S. public policy organizations
- Informing the Angolan Government of relevant articles, reports and studies
- Assisting in the preparation of official Angolan Government correspondence and public remarks
- Preparing reports on selected topics
- Facilitating "sister city" relationships

B. Term

The term of this contract shall begin on the date of signature by both parties and continue unless either party gives 30 days notice that it intends to end the contractual arrangement.

Additional Services

Should SIA be requested to provide services outside the scope of the present contract, details, including additional fees, will be subject to mutual agreement by both parties.

Nothing in this contract between the Government of the Republic of Angola and Samuels International Associates is intended to preclude SIA having corporate clients with investment or trading interests in Angola. It will be the responsibility of SIA to inform the Angolan Government in advance concerning the fact, bearing in mind that the interests of the Angolan Government will always take priority.

Fees, Expenses and Travel

A. Annual compensation: 675,000 USD. Payments are to be made in advance on a quarterly basis.

B. Funded Travel:

- (1) The contract should include provisions for four (4) individual visits by SIA personnel annually to Angola. Additional reimbursed visits may be undertaken with the approval of both parties.
- (2) Given the importance of Angolan elections, at least one of the annual visits should take place in conjunction with these events (e.g., before, during or after).
- (3) Air travel should be business class and arrangements for lodging and ground transportation while in Angola should be facilitated by the Government of Angola.

C. Administrative Expenses: The Angolan Government will reimburse administrative expenses based upon the presentation of reference bills.
