## Ukraine Targets Moscow With Its Largest Drone Bombardment of War

Attacks Increase Ahead of Talks

KYIV, Ukraine — Russian warplanes and drones attacked Moscow's southern suburbs Tuesday night, marking the heaviest bombardment of the city since the start of the war, as both sides stepped up attacks ahead of talks in Washington.

The Ukrainian military said it had targeted Moscow's air activity, which possibly means that a fleet of fast-moving cruise missiles was used, similar to the one that struck a residential station in the Kiev region.
