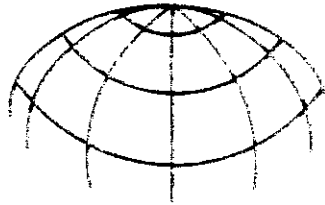

Dear Sir,

I am happy to confirm receipt of your correspondence of 16 May in which you request the "finalized, detailed information" concerning the contract for consulting, public and media relations, and lobbying services between Washington World Group, Ltd. and the Agency for Humanitarian Technologies, on behalf of the Government of Ukraine.

Based upon our previous exchange of correspondence, this letter of understanding will constitute an Agreement.

THIS AGREEMENT is made between WASHINGTON WORLD GROUP LTD. (hereinafter referred to as WWG) and the AGENCY FOR HUMANITARIAN TECHNOLOGIES (hereinafter referred to as AHT).

In consideration of the terms and conditions set forth in this Agreement, WWG and AHT agree as follows:

1. **Effective Date and Term**. This Agreement will enter into effect on the date whence both parties have signed the Agreement. The Agreement will remain in effect for four calendar months, unless the Term is extended by mutual agreement in writing.

2. **Description of Services**. Throughout the duration of the effective period of the contract, WWG will provide public relations and media relations services to AHT on

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behalf of its clients and related business interests in Ukraine. WWG will further provide strategic counsel and lobbying services on an as needed basis to AHT and its clients.

- a. **Media Relations.** WWG will arrange for a total of at least 10 publications during the 4 months of the contract in each of the two target press outlets, "International and Domestic."

Of the "international-oriented" publications we will target will be: The New York Times, The Washington Post, The Washington Times, The Christian Science Monitor, The Financial Times, The International Herald Tribune, The Los Angeles Times, The Wall Street Journal and The Baltimore Sun.

Of the "domestic-oriented" publications we will target will be: The Boston Globe, The Detroit Free Press, The Chicago Tribune, The Chicago Sun-Times, The Philadelphia Inquirer, The St. Louis Post Dispatch, The Cleveland Plain Dealer, The San Francisco Chronicle, The San Jose Mercury News, and others.

These placements will be in the form of: 1) Opinion-Editorial pieces, prepared by WWG staff, in coordination with the wishes and policies of AHT and its clients, and signed by prominent individuals who will give authority to the piece; or 2) Opinion-Editorials drafted by leading syndicated columnists; 3) original articles by leading journalists; or 4) Letters-to-the-editor. In the latter two cases, WWG will work with the writers to provide background information, briefings, talking points, important facts and all other assistance to ensure that a proper perspective is presented to the reader.

In this regard, we envisage that approximately one-half of all placements will be original articles, drafted by leading journalists; that one-quarter will be written by various syndicated columnists; and that the remaining quarter will be in the form of original Opinion-Editorial pieces and letters-to-the-editor.

- b. **Visit Coordination.** WWG will arrange to send leading journalists and syndicated columnists to Ukraine to meet with high officials within Ukraine's government and private sectors. WWG will work closely with AHT in the targeting of fair-minded journalists and in providing in-depth briefings on their past writings and opinions. On-ground coordination in Ukraine for these journalists will be handled by AHT.
- c. **Public Relations and Lobbying.** WWG will monitor all relevant Congressional committees for any new legislation that could affect U.S.-Ukrainian relations, including but not limited to the Subcommittee on International Operations and Human Right, the Congressional-Helsinki Commission and the Subcommittee on Europe. WWG will provide briefings on any new legislation to AHT and other designated Ukrainian officials, as needed, on the origin and potential effects of new legislation. WWG will assist in arranging meetings for and interacting on behalf of AHT, or other relevant Ukrainian officials, with Members of Congress and their staff, human

rights groups, academic groups and think tanks, as well as all nature of relevant ethnic Ukrainian groups in the United States, on an as-needed basis.

3. **Compensation.** AHT shall compensate WWG for services provided under this agreement as follows:

- a. **Fixed Monthly Retainer.** AHT shall pay WWG a fixed retainer based upon a monthly project rate of US\$25,000 (twenty-five thousand United States Dollars). The first tranche of the payment shall be equal to one-half of the total due and will be paid upon the signing of the contract by both parties. The second, and final, tranche of the payment shall be paid two months after the signing of the agreement. This fee is to include all normal business operating costs and taxes related to the administration of this account. Future work extensions will be renegotiated subject to past performance.
- b. **Reimbursement of Expenses.** AHT will reimburse WWG for all expenses mutually agreed to beforehand, which are considered to be extra-ordinary. This is to include, but not be limited to, any international or domestic travel by WWG staff members and/or invited guests; local accommodations; ground transportation; meals; and all other incidental expenses associated with travel.

AHT shall also pay other such fees as WWG and AHT agree to on occasion, including \$5,000 USD per month to be deposited in an escrow account to cover all local operating expenses, such as international courier services, faxing, telephones, photocopying, etc. If at the end of the contract WWG has not provided fees and expenses equivalent to the retainer they will return the balance to AHT.


- c. **Transfer instructions.** All payments to WWG under this Agreement shall be paid by wire transfer to:

4. **Oversight.** Controlling authority for this agreement rests with the Chairman of WWG and with the designated representative of AHT. WWG will furthermore provide AHT with weekly written reports of its activities throughout the duration of the Agreement. Written reports will be supplemented with personal liaisioning via private means with officers of AHT and other relevant Ukrainian authorities, as designated.

5. **Compliance.** As a Registered Foreign Agent, WWG is responsible for filing this contract and all related documentation to the Agreement with the Department of Justice under the provisions of the Foreign Agents Registration Act. Thus, WWG's activities on behalf of AHT will become a matter of public record.
