Memorandum Describing Arrangements for Compensation Existing
Between the Registrant and the Government of the French Republic.

The registrant, a firm of lawyers having offices in Washington, D. C. and New York City, N. Y., serves as General Counsel for the Supply Council of the Government of France and the missions in the United States connected with the Supply Council and from time to time also represents other Departments and agencies of the French Government. As counsel for the French Supply Council the registrant renders legal services, including advice on questions of law, the preparation and trial of cases, the drafting and negotiation of legal documents and arrangements of all kinds, and other similar matters. Registrant is compensated for its services to the French Supply Council by a retainer in the amount of \$1200. per month plus compensation for particular matters that under the arrangement shall not amount to more than an additional \$1900. per month. In addition, for matters that require the expenditure of an unusual amount of time, the registrant and the Government of the Republic of France from time to time enter into special compensation arrangements. Typical of matters falling into this class are protracted litigations or hearings and studies of, and advice on, special legal, financial or economic problems.
