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DESCRIPTION OF ACTIVITIES OF REGISTRANT FOR
EACH FOREIGN PRINCIPAL NAMED UNDER ITEM 6.

1. Government of the French Republic.

Registrant acts as counsel to the French Financial Counselor, the French Commercial Counselor, and the French Financial Controller, who are representatives of the Government of the French Republic. In this capacity, partners and associates of the registrant advise these officers with respect to American legislative proposals, and administrative regulations which affect French trade and French financial and commercial interests. Registrant also advises these officers with respect to contracts and other business transactions.

In addition, registrant has participated in arbitration and court proceedings incident to and resulting from contracts entered into by the French Supply Office, 1800 Massachusetts Avenue, N.W., Washington, D.C.

Registrant also acts as counsel to the French Air, Naval and Military Attaches, who are officers of the Government of the French Republic. In this capacity, partners and associates of the registrant advise these officers with respect to contracts and also with respect to leases, litigation, etc., in which these officers have an interest.

2. Conseil National du Patronat Francais.

Registrant advises Patronat Francais (and, at its request, related associations such as Comite France Actuelle) with respect to ordinary legal matters such as letters, contracts, loans, as well as with respect to American legislative and administrative proposals, and communicates individually with other interested persons in the United States.

3. European Coal and Steel Community.

Registrant acts as counsel to the High Authority of the European Coal and Steel Community. In this capacity, partners and associates of the registrant advise members and staff of the High Authority, as well as other officials of the European Coal and Steel Community, with respect to American legislative and administrative acts and proposals affecting trade between Europe and the United States, mutual security, control of exports, financing, and other subjects of interest to the Community. In addition, partners and associates of the registrant furnish general legal advice to the United States Information Office of the Community with respect to ordinary legal matters such as contracts. An employee of the staff of the registrant supervises the United States Information Office, which disseminates information about the Community to various segments of the American press and public by means of periodical and other publications, speeches, and personal conversations.

4. National Cuban Mill Owners Association.
Cuban Sugar Cane Growers Association.

Registrant advises the National Cuban Mill Owners Association and the Cuban Sugar Cane Growers Association with respect to legislative and administrative proposals and actions which affect U.S. sugar quotas in particular and trade between Cuba and the United States in general. In this connection, registrant communicates individually with other interested persons in the United States and advises and consults with other individuals and groups interested in the goal of expansion of trade between Cuba and the United States on a basis that is mutually beneficial to both countries.
