This letter is to memorialize the agreement for me to act on behalf of the Embassy of Pakistan in a variety of ways to further the foreign policy objectives of Pakistan beginning August 1, 1997 at a remuneration of \$3,500.00 per month.

My expected tasks will include writing columns, letters to the editor, monographs, letters to Members of Congress and the Executive Branch; organizing symposia on such issues as Kashmir and nuclear and missile non-proliferation at "think tanks", e.g., CSIS, the Heritage Foundation, the Brookings Institute, and at universities; speaking to important audiences as a lecturer or panelist; providing legal advice on potential lawsuits or legislation; lobbying with key Members of Congress, staff, and Executive Branch officials wielding prime influence over issues of concern to Pakistan; arranging meetings with editorial boards of prominent newspapers; and, in general suggesting strategies and tactics to strengthen and to harmonize Pakistan-United States relations.

I look forward to enthusiasm to embarking on this vital undertaking.
