

Privacy Act Statement. CONSULTING AND PUBLIC RELATIONS

This letter will serve to confirm and memorialize the terms of the agreement reached today between the Taipei Economic and Cultural Representative Office, hereinafter referred to as "TECRO," and Mr. David M. Lonie, hereinafter referred to as "DML."

It has been agreed that DML has been engaged by TECRO for the purposes hereinafter described, said engagement to be effective January 1, 1999 and extending for a period of 12 months thereafter to December 31, 1999, unless the relationship shall be extended and/or renegotiated by the parties.


The compensation to be paid to DML shall be the sum of two thousand (\$2,000) U.S. DOLLARS, payable monthly, in advance, during the term of this agreement.

The obligation of DML will be to represent the Republic of China before foreign governments (including the United States) in joining international organizations and being officially recognized by foreign governments (including the United States). The Representative of TECRO will serve as liaison between TECRO and DML.

DML and TECRO agree that the level of remuneration shall be subject to review should the services requested by TECRO exceed that envisioned in this agreement.


