

Privacy Act Statement. CONTRACT


The Embassy of Japan, 2520 Massachusetts Avenue, N.W., Washington D.C. 20008 (hereinafter referred to as "the Embassy") and Dr. R. Ian Butterfield, partner, Butterfield Carter and Associates, 1010 Pennsylvania Avenue, S.E., Washington D.C. 20003, have agreed as follows:

1. Butterfield Carter and Associates agrees to provide assistance to the Embassy on the issue of whaling. That assistance shall take the form of policy research, advice and advocacy. These activities shall be directed towards both the U.S. Government and the U.S. public.
2. Butterfield Carter and Associates shall make a comprehensive report to the Embassy regarding the U.S. position on Japan's whaling policy by March 30, 2001.
3. The Embassy agrees to pay Butterfield Carter and Associates \$20, 000 (twenty thousand dollars) upon receipt of the report.
4. The report and its contents shall be the property of the Japanese Government. Butterfield Carter and Associates shall not disclose the contents of the report to any third party without the expressed permission of the Japanese Government.
