



Dear Mr. Prime Minister,

We are delighted that the Kurdistan Regional Government (KRG) has agreed to continue and expand its relationship with Barbour Griffith & Rogers, LLC (BGR). Please accept this letter of agreement to continue our work on your behalf, based specifically upon our discussions in Irbil last week and our November 28, 2005, proposal for services from Ambassador Blackwill.

**Scope of Work:** Our representation will include providing strategic counsel and tactical planning on legislative, regulatory and political matters before the U.S. Government, including the U.S. Congress. BGR will also work with the KRG to facilitate relationships between the KRG and various non-governmental organizations, and to promote foreign investment and economic development in the Kurdish region of Iraq.

**Fees, Terms & Expenses:** In consideration for the services provided by BGR, the KRG agrees to pay BGR an annual fee of US\$700,000.00 for services beginning January 1, 2006, and ending January 31, 2009. This fee will be payable in quarterly installments of US\$175,000.00 each.

Additionally, the KRG agrees to reimburse BGR for ordinary and out-of-pocket expenses, including items such as telecommunications services, printing, photocopying, local transportation and other incidental expenses. BGR will also be reimbursed for non-local transportation, meals and entertainment; however these will be authorized by you in advance.

**Invoicing:** Professional fees and expenses are invoiced separately:

1. **Professional Fees:** BGR will invoice the KRG on the first day of each quarter for professional fees in advance of the coming quarter, starting January 1, 2006.
2. **Expenses:** BGR will invoice the KRG on the last day of each month for expenses incurred during the month prior, starting, January 31, 2006.

Regardless of the ultimate duration of the Agreement, all invoices generated from the terms and between the two parties to this agreement are payable in-full and promptly upon receipt and shall be paid directly to BGR.

**Renewal & Extension:** This contract can be renewed and extended upon notice by either party to the other and upon agreement of both, beyond the set termination date for a mutually agreed-upon term commencing on the first day following the previous contractual termination date.

BGR agrees to maintain that confidentiality and will not disclose to any outside party the information either during the period of a contract or afterwards, to the extent permitted by law.

**Entire Understanding:** This Agreement contains the entire understanding between the parties. Amendment, modification or waiver of this agreement may be accomplished with a written instrument signed by both parties.

Please sign both copies of this agreement and return one to us. We are looking forward to a long and productive relationship with the KRG and we are eager to start working on your behalf.
