

CONSULTING SERVICES AGREEMENT – PUBLIC RELATIONS

THIS CONSULTING SERVICES AGREEMENT (the “Agreement”), effective June 1, 2024, is made by and between:

BGR Group (the “Consultant”)

1. **Term.** The Term of this Agreement shall commence on June 1, 2024 (the “Effective Date”), and shall expire on COB December 31, 2024, unless earlier terminated in accordance with the Agreement. The Term may be extended only upon execution of a written amendment, signed by the authorized representatives of both parties.
2. **Scope of Services.** During the Term, Consultant shall perform the services (the “Services”) described in Appendix A.
3. **Compensation to Consultant.** In consideration for the Services performed under this Agreement, the Embassy shall compensate Consultant in accordance with Appendix B.
4. **Disclosure of Actual or Potential Conflicts of Interest.** During the Term, Consultant shall provide prompt written notice to Embassy of any Consultant engagement to advise or represent a sovereign state in the MENA Region (as defined by the World Bank), other than the State of Qatar, or any entity that is substantially owned or controlled by such states, other than the State of Qatar. Consultant shall promptly disclose to the Embassy any actual or potential conflicts of interest that arise in the course of any engagement undertaken by Consultant.
5. **Confidentiality.** Consultant agrees that all documents, information or communications (whether verbal or recorded) exchanged between Consultant and the Embassy (including the Embassy’s officers, employees, contractors, or attorneys), and any information generated or received by Consultant in the course of performance of this Agreement, are confidential, and will not be disclosed by Consultant to any person except as authorized by the Embassy, or as required by law, or to the extent such information is in the public domain. Consultant agrees that Consultant will not use any confidential information for any purpose other than performance of this Agreement. Any deliverable that Consultant

produces in the performance of this Agreement shall be the sole property of the Embassy, and may be used by the Embassy without restriction. This provision shall survive expiration or termination of this Agreement.


- 6. Independent Contractor.** Consultant's services shall be performed in the capacity of an independent contractor. This Agreement is not intended to establish an employer-employee relationship, or principal-agent relationship. Consultant is not authorized to commit the Embassy or the State of Qatar to any cost, contract, or other obligation. Consultant is not authorized by this Agreement to act as a spokesperson or agent on behalf of the State of Qatar or the Embassy in any political activity, in any public or private statement or informational materials, or in any media statement or interview, except upon Embassy direction.
- 7. Compliance with Law.** In the execution and performance of this Agreement, Consultant confirms that Consultant has complied, and will comply, with all applicable laws. Without limiting the generality of the foregoing, Consultant will comply with all federal and state laws, regulations and orders applicable to its operations and the services provided hereunder, including, without limitation the Foreign Corrupt Practices Act of 1977, 15 U.S.C. §§78dd-1, et. seq., a U.S. law that prohibits payments to foreign officials for the purpose of obtaining or keeping business, the Foreign Agent Registration Act, the Honest Leadership and Open Government Act, the Lobbying Disclosure Act as amended, and/or other applicable U.S. state lobbying laws. Consultant represents and warrants that it will comply with all applicable registration and disclosure requirements.
- 8. Responsibility for Consultant Employees and Subcontractors.** Consultant shall be responsible for assuring that Consultant's employees and subcontractors assigned to performance of this Agreement, if any, will comply with Paragraphs 4, 5, 6 and 7 of this Agreement.
- 9. Limitation of Liability.** Embassy agrees that neither Consultant nor any of its employees, directors, agents, representatives, shareholders, officers or controlling persons shall have any liability to the Embassy, its employees, directors, shareholders, officers, representatives, or controlling persons, for any damages arising out of or related to Consultant's performance of services under this Agreement, except to the extent that such damages result from Consultant's breach of its obligations hereunder or from its gross negligence or willful misconduct. Consultant agrees that neither Embassy nor any of its employees, directors, agents, representatives, shareholders, officers or controlling persons shall have any liability to the Consultant, its employees, directors, shareholders, officers, representatives, or controlling persons, for any damages arising out of or related to Embassy's performance of services under this Agreement, except to the extent that such damages result from Embassy's breach of its obligations hereunder or from its gross negligence or willful misconduct.
- 10. Termination.** This Agreement may be terminated by the Embassy or Consultant at any time, without cause, and such termination shall be effective 30 calendar days after written notice. In the event of such termination, Consultant's compensation shall be prorated to the effective date of termination.


11. Disputes. Any controversy or claim arising out of or relating to this Agreement, or the breach thereof, shall be settled exclusively by arbitration administered by the American Arbitration Association in accordance with its Commercial Arbitration Rules, and judgment on the award rendered by the arbitrator(s) may be entered in any court having jurisdiction thereof. The number of arbitrators shall be one, and the place of arbitration shall be Washington, D.C.

12. General Provisions.

- a. Neither party may assign, subcontract or otherwise transfer any of its rights, duties or obligations under this Agreement without prior written consent from the other party.
- b. The parties reserve all rights and remedies arising from a breach of this Agreement; provided, however, that neither party shall be liable to the other party for indirect, consequential, or punitive damages, irrespective of the nature of the claim or cause of action.
- c. No failure or delay by a party in exercising any right or remedy shall operate as a waiver of these or any other rights and remedies.
- d. No modification, extension or renewal of this Agreement shall be effective unless reflected in a written agreement executed by the parties.
- e. Nothing in this Agreement shall waive or alter the privileges and immunities to which the Embassy is entitled under the laws of the United States or any other jurisdiction.
- f. This Agreement reflects the entire agreement between Embassy and Consultant, and supersedes any prior agreements with respect to this subject.

APPENDIX A: SCOPE OF SERVICES

The Services shall include the following:

Public relations advice and assistance to support the Embassy in advancing the bilateral relationship between the State of Qatar and the United States, including assistance with Embassy communications and preparation of materials for use by Embassy.

Consultant shall plan and assist Embassy in organizing and managing regional events (the "Regional Events") in United States cities outside of Washington, D.C., to be selected, for the purpose of promoting expanded trade, investment, philanthropy, and academic or cultural exchanges between Qatar and American communities.

All resources of Consultant will be available to Embassy in performance of the Services. Consultant's team will be led by Jeff Birnbaum, who shall be personally and substantially involved in delivery of the Services.

APPENDIX B: COMPENSATION AND PAYMENTS

In consideration for the Services performed under this Agreement, the Embassy shall compensate Consultant during the Term as follows:

1. **Consulting Fee:** For the Services rendered pursuant to this Agreement, the Embassy shall pay Consultant a fixed consulting fee (the "Consulting Fee") of US\$ 35,000 per month. The Consulting Fee shall be payable on the first day of each calendar month during the Term. For the avoidance of doubt, the first payment shall be due June 1, 2024.
2. **Exclusions from Consulting Fee:** The Consulting Fee is inclusive of all fees and expenses of Consultant for delivering the Services, except as follows:
 - a. The Consulting Fee shall not include third-party expenses incurred for paid media, video or graphics production, or related third-party goods or services. Embassy shall reimburse such expenses case by case, provided that the corresponding budgets are approved by Embassy in advance in writing.
 - b. The Consulting Fee shall not include third-party expenses incurred for the Regional Events. Embassy shall reimburse such expenses case by case, provided that the corresponding budgets are approved by Embassy in advance in writing. For the avoidance of doubt, the Consulting Fee shall be inclusive of Consultant's fees associated with planning, managing and delivering any Services associated with the Regional Events.
 - c. Embassy shall reimburse Consultant for (a) reasonable (business class or equivalent) expenses (including travel-related accommodations and meals) for travel that is approved in advance in writing by Embassy; and (b) such other expenses as are approved in advance in writing by Embassy.
3. **Invoices:** Consultant shall provide the Embassy with written invoices in advance of all payments or expense reimbursements required by this Agreement. Upon request, Consultant shall provide records sufficient to support all reimbursement invoices for Embassy-approved expenses.
4. **Payment Instructions:** Embassy shall make all payments and reimbursements required by this Agreement according to Consultant's written instructions (separately provided) for payments via electronic funds transfer.
