We are pleased that the Kurdistan Regional Government (KRG) has agreed to continue to retain BGR Government Affairs, LLC (BGR) to represent its interests in the United States. BGR will assist KRG and Kurdistan to develop and provide KRG with strategic advice, counsel and analysis of political climate domestically and abroad regarding Kurdistan. BGR will provide public relations assistance to increase and promote the image of KRG. However, this contract is at-will and could be terminated by either party with a 30-day notice.
