**Subject:** ICYMI: Two Historians Disagree with UN Resolution on Srebrenica

Two prominent professors and historians have voiced their disagreement with a pending United Nations' resolution about the 1995 Srebrenica massacre in Republika Srpska, Bosnia and Herzegovina.

Efraim Zuroff, a Holocaust historian and chief Nazi-hunter of the Simon Wiesenthal Center and the founder and director of its Israel office, in a new opinion piece in the Jerusalem Post, argues for caution and consensus, stating: "The upcoming United Nations General Assembly (UNGA) resolution to officially recognize the Srebrenica massacre as a genocide is a well-intentioned move plagued by potential pitfalls that could exacerbate tensions rather than foster reconciliation." Professor Jehuda Bauer, a leading authority on Holocaust and genocide issues at Hebrew University in Jerusalem, also weighed in with an interview, stating: "Srebrenica cannot be considered a typical case of genocide." ([Read more](#))

The government of Serbia opposes the resolution because it would undermine the delicate peace and stability in Bosnia and Herzegovina and threatens to derail essential reconciliation efforts that have been painstakingly advanced by all parties.
