

3. Visits by BNP officials were as follows:

In March 1999 Scottish BNP member Steven Cartwright, visited America for just over two weeks. Most of this time was spent socializing and sightseeing, Mr. Cartwright spoke at three meetings, two sponsored by the National Alliance (in Richmond, VA, and Baltimore, MD) and one sponsored by the AFBNP in Arlington, VA. Mr. Cartwright's travel costs were paid for in total by an American supporter of the BNP (although not an AFBNP member) from Wayne, Illinois. Mr. Cartwright received no payment at all from the AFBNP.

In July 1999 BNP Webmaster Mr. Simon Darby, visited America for two weeks. Most of this time was spent socializing and sightseeing, although Mr. Darby did speak at one AFBNP-sponsored meeting: one in Falls Church, VA, the second Richmond, VA. Mr. Darby paid for the whole trip himself and received no payment at all from the AFBNP.

In January/February 2000 BNP member Steven King Brady, visited America for two weeks. Most of this time was spent sightseeing, although Mr. King-Brady did speak at two AFBNP sponsored meetings: one in Arlington, VA and the second in West Palm Beach, FL. Mr. King-Brady paid for the whole trip himself and received no payment at all from the AFBNP.

In April 2000. BNP national chairman Mr. Nick Griffin visited the DC area for four days. Most of this time was spent meeting American political figures. Mr. Griffin was a guest speaker at one AFBNP meeting in Arlington, VA during his short visit. Mr. Griffin's travel costs were paid for in total by an American supporter of the BNP (although not an AFBNP member) from Wayne, Illinois. Mr. Griffin received no payment at all from the AFBNP.

In July 2000. BNP Webmaster Mr. Simon Darby, again visited America for two weeks. Most of this time was spent socializing and sightseeing, although Mr. Darby did speak at three AFBNP-sponsored meetings: one in Arlington, VA, the second Richmond, VA, and the third in Lake Worth, FL. Mr. Darby paid for the whole trip himself and received no payment at all from the AFBNP.

In August 2000. BNP member Mr. Richard Brook and his wife visited her family in VA and NJ for two weeks. All but one day was spent with their family socializing and sightseeing. Mr. Brook was a guest speaker at one AFBNP meeting in Arlington. The Brooks paid for the trip themselves and received no payment at all from the AFBNP.

In May 2001 BNP national chairman Mr. Nick Griffin and his wife visited America for a week. Mr. Griffin spoke at three meetings, one sponsored by the National Organization for European-American Rights in Richmond, VA, one sponsored by the Council of Conservative Citizens in Fort Lee, NJ and one sponsored by the AFBNP in Arlington, VA. Mr. and Mrs. Griffin paid for themselves to fly over to the States, however collections were taken at all three meetings to help defray the costs of their trip; apart from this the Griffins received no payment at all from the AFBNP.

Section B. *Heritage And Destiny*.

The AFBNP published a newsletter/magazine called – *Heritage And Destiny*. Altogether 9 (nine) issues were published, as follows.

Issue 1. Summer 1999. – 8 pages.

Issue 2 Fall 1999 – 12 pages.

Issue 3 Winter/Spring 2000 – 12 pages.

Issue 4 Summer 2000 – 16 pages.

Issue 5 Fall 2000 – 20 pages.

Issue 6 January/February 2001 – 20 pages.

Issue 7 March/April 2001 – 20 pages.

Issue 8 May/June 2001 – 20 pages.

Issue 9 July/August 2001 – 20 pages.

Sample copies of all 9 issues of *Heritage And Destiny* were filed as information material with the U.S. Department of Justice FARA Unit.

Section C. Other Publications.

We circulated the BNP's three monthly publications: *The Voice of Freedom* newspaper, *Identity* magazine, and *British Nationalist* bulletin to our members (all AFBNP members received these three publications – as well as *Heritage and Destiny* – as part of their membership). Sample copies of these three publications were filed as information material with the U.S. Department of Justice FARA Unit.

Section D. Website.

We maintained an Internet website (URL-www.americabnp.net) from roughly August 1999 to August 2001. The site included most of what was in *Heritage And Destiny*, but also some longer articles and more photos, which we could not fit into a small newsletter. We also sent irregular E-Mail bulletins.
