7. Describe fully the nature and method of performance of the above indicated agreement or understanding.
There are two contracts between the Embassy and me. Both are paid quarterly and run from April 1, 2002 to March 31, 2003. The contracts have not yet been renewed for the coming year.

8. Describe fully the activities the registrant engages in or proposes to engage in on behalf of the above foreign principal.

My work for the Embassy involves writing speeches and remarks to be given before a variety of audiences. The audiences range from charitable (such as fundraisers for St. Alban's School and Woodley House) to cultural (such as those associated with the recent Cherry Blossom Festival). Other events are more substantive (such as lectures at Gettysburg College in Pennsylvania or at the Center for Strategic and International Studies here in Washington). In the past, I have worked on many speeches to be delivered before Japan-America Societies across the United States. Also, many speeches have been delivered before Japan-U.S. business groups, such as the Japan-U.S. Southeast Association.

If yes, describe all such political activities indicating, among other things, the relations, interests or policies to be influenced together with the means to be employed to achieve this purpose.

I am told by the Department of Justice that my activities are political but I have a hard time accepting that. What I do is help the Embassy reinforce the friendship and alliance of the United States and Japan. The major point the speeches are making right now is that Japan is a firm friend of the United States, and that it is good to have friends in a world of terrorism, Iraq and North Korea.

Prior to the current international situation, the speeches would deal with how the Japanese economy and society are changing. Of course, there are also many artistic and cultural events where remarks are made that have no relation to anything political or diplomatic. I see what I do as educational and informative rather than political, and I do not disseminate anything.

The Embassy of Japan, Washington, D.C. (the "Embassy") and Landon Parvin, 1218 Sophia Street, Fredericksburg, VA 22401 ("Parvin) have agreed as follows:

1. Parvin will provide Ambassador's speeches, some appropriate suggestions and performance analysis.
2. Parvin's service will be limited to providing advice to the Embassy and will not include engaging in political activities
3. The Embassy will pay Parvin as compensation for his services \$12,500 at the end of each quarter.
4. Parvin will provide up to approximately 144 hours of time pursuant to this agreement. 
