Below is a statement that you can attribute on the record to a spokesperson for the Argentine Republic. On background, and not for attribution, I hope you will note in your coverage as a matter of fact that to comply with the order, the Argentine Republic would have to violate Argentine law, with requires the National Congress to vote by a two-thirds majority to transfer the shares.

“The Republic is very disappointed by the trial court’s unprecedented turnover ruling. It is wrong on the law, directly contrary to the U.S. Government's position as expressed in this case, and will directly interfere with U.S. foreign policy interests. The Republic will seek a stay of this order and will appeal to the U.S. Court of Appeals for the Second Circuit.”
