CONTRACT WITH INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR

Contract between the Korean Cultural Service, Embassy of the Republic of Korea, 2370 Massachusetts Avenue, N.W., Washington, DC 20008, herein referred to as the Embassy, and EMANUEL PASTRZYCH herein referred to as the Contractor.

The Contractor has agreed to perform the following services:

- Summarize and translate Korea-related articles on key U.S. newspapers
- Produce articles for the Dynamic Korea website
- Research related to U.S. policies and public diplomacy
- Organize events such as symposiums and seminars for Korea-related issues

NATURE/HOURS OF WORK

The Work to be performed by Contractor includes all services generally performed by Contractor in her usual line of business, including but not limited to all programs carried out by the Embassy. The Contractor has agreed to work for 40 hours per week, from 7:00 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. with some flexibility in the hours for work performed overtime. The content of duties may be adjusted or changed upon the request from the Embassy.

PAYMENT

The Korean Cultural Service agrees to payment to the Contractor as follows:

Gross yearly salary : \$40,800
Monthly Salary : \$3,400

Date of payment: 25th day of each month

The Korean Cultural Service also agrees to provide the Contractor the following:

- A) Holiday leave: 10 U.S. Federal and 4 Korean national holidays
- B) Annual leave: The Employee shall have seven working days of leave during the first year of employment, which may be taken after the first six months. After each year,

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the Employee will accrue an additional day of leave, but only up to a maximum of fifteen days. The timing of leave shall be arranged with the Employer.

- C) Sick leave: up to 14 days per year, with appropriate medical certification
- D) Parking: space provided at the Korean Embassy lot

CONTRACT TERM

The contract will be in effect for 10 months, from March 7, 2005 to December 31, 2005.

If the contract renewal process is delayed beyond 1/1/2006, the terms of the current contract will remain in effect until a renewed contract is signed. Terms for the new Contract will be retroactive to 1/1/2006.

Either party may cancel this Contract with one month's written notice.

The parties intend that an independent contractor-employer relationship will be created by this Contract. The work contemplated herein must meet the approval of the Korean Cultural Service, and shall be subject to the Korean Cultural Service's general right of inspection and supervision to secure the satisfactory completion thereof. The Contractor will be responsible for his acts during the performance of the Contract.
