

1. Summary of Services--PPS is being retained to provide strategic consulting and legislative outreach services with respect to advance passage of the KORUS Free Trade Agreement in 2009. Scott Parven, Van McMurtry, Ali Lapp and Melissa Wier will represent you on this matter.

2. Period of Representation--PPS will provide these services to you for the period January 1, 2009 through June 30, 2009 and the contract can be extended under the same terms, by written mutual agreement, through December 31, 2009. The contract may be terminated by either party's written notice to the other party, provided that the notice shall be given at least thirty (30) days prior to the termination.


3. Fees--The Fee for the six-month retainer shall be \$120,000 and shall be paid in full immediately upon agreeing to the above terms. In the event of early termination, as described above, PPS shall return a pro-rata share of the fee before the date of termination.

4. Scope of Engagement--PPS will advance the interests of the Free Trade Agreement by making outreach to Democratic Members of Congress and the Administration.

5. Conflicts of Interest--PPS shall immediately notify the Embassy in case a potential conflict of representation arises.

6. Confidentiality-- PPS will keep confidential the strategy and work plan of the contract and such information will not be disclosed without the written consent of the Embassy. PPS will maintain records of work-product and will provide a monthly report of services to the Embassy.
