

## 2. Ministry of Information, Republic of Liberia

During this contract period, KRL worked with the Government of Liberia to support its response to COVID-19. This included working with the US administration and the Congress to advocate for emergency assistance to the country given that it was still recovering from the impact of the Ebola epidemic in 2016. Outreach also include the donor institutions, the private sector and various media houses. Finally, special attention was dedicated to building a public-private donations platform to inject greater transparency into systems and encourage more donor and private support to Liberia.
