

## **EQUATORIAL GUINEA TO HOLD NATIONAL CONFERENCE TO DIVERSIFY ITS ECONOMY AND PROMOTE STABILITY**

Malabo – Continuing his ongoing efforts to develop and modernize the country, the President of Equatorial Guinea, Teodoro Obiang Nguema Mbasogo, has called for a second National Economic Conference to devise a consensus strategy to diversify the economy and promote long standing internal stability across the country through the year 2020. The conference will to be held November 12 – November 14 in the city of Bata on the continental Río Muni portion of the country.

“The goal of the conference is to help us achieve sustainable development and improve the standard of living for all Equatorial Guineans,” said President Obiang. “A diversified economy will help the country grow stronger.”

The economic conference will make a comprehensive review of the current situation in Equatorial Guinea, determine how oil and natural gas revenues should be spent over the next ten years, perform a diagnostic of the competitiveness of the economy, and conduct a breakdown analysis of which sectors of the economy can and should be diversified. Although Equatorial Guinea is the third largest producer of oil in Africa and the fourteenth producer of liquefied natural gas in the world, the country’s leaders are cognizant of the problems that over dependence on one natural resource, such as oil, can cause.

To emphasize inclusion, democracy and the true national importance of the conference, participants will include members from all the ministries of the government; federal, provincial and local elected officials from across the country; as well as tribal elders and political opposition members as domestic observers. Representatives from various international organizations such as the International Monetary Fund, the World Bank, and USAID, as well as delegations from the United States, Spain, and France will all attend the conference.

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**UNITED NATIONS WORKING GROUP ON ARBITRARY DETENTION  
CONCLUDES VISIT TO EQUATORIAL GUINEA**

Washington, DC – During a five day visit to the Republic of Equatorial Guinea from July 8 to July 13, 2007, the United Nations Working Group on Arbitrary Detention was given unfettered access to government officials, aid workers and detention facilities and allowed private interviews with 200 prisoners.

Manuela Carmena Castrillo, upon presenting the findings of the working group's trip, stressed that "the mere fact that the Government of Equatorial Guinea has accepted the Working Group's request for an invitation is already a positive sign. It conveys the message that the Government is willing to cooperate with the mechanisms of the Human Rights Council."

Castrillo continued her positive remarks by stressing that there was still work to be done, but that "The Working Group notes with appreciation that the Government of Equatorial Guinea has already introduced a process of reforming the legal regime and institutions governing deprivation of liberty and of training of the authorities involved."

Castrillo also noted as positive, the recent activity of the government's National Human Rights Commission of Equatorial Guinea. The commission completed visits throughout the country in 2006 and according to Castrillo, the "conclusions contained therein are accurate, critical, candid . . .and suitable to improve the human rights situation in prisons."

While understanding that the development of Human Rights best practices is a work in progress, the working group suggested a course of action to improve registration and accountability protocols for detention facilities.

Equatorial Guinea remains active in the international community and intends to work with international organizations to develop better standards and protocols. The government recognizes that there is work to be done and is fully prepared to undertake the challenges of developing the country both economically and socially.

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## **Isakson Visits Equatorial Guinea, Tours LNG Facility**

Equatorial Guinea's Natural Gas fuels growth in South Georgia and Florida

**Malabo-** U.S. Senator Johnny Isakson, R-Ga., yesterday arrived in Malabo, Equatorial Guinea for a series of meetings with energy industry and political leaders. While in Equatorial Guinea, Senator Isakson will visit the two largest cities of Malabo and Bata, as well as the Liquefied Natural Gas (LNG) facility at Punta Europa.

Equatorial Guinea, the 14<sup>th</sup> global exporter of LNG, is expected to deliver \$11 billion of LNG per year to United States markets by way of Elba Island, Georgia and Lake Charles, Louisiana. Commencing production in May 2007, the Equatorial Guinean LNG terminal is expected to produce between 3.4 and 3.7 million metric tons of LNG per year.

"Not only does Equatorial Guinea's Natural Gas provide a cleaner alternative to traditional fossil fuels, but it also provides jobs to American workers in Georgia," Isakson said. "Energy security is important to United States foreign policy, and Equatorial Guinea is a substantial piece of the energy security puzzle."

Upon Senator Isakson's arrival, Gabriel Mbega Obiang Lima, Vice Minister of Mines and Energy affirmed that, "Equatorial Guinea's production capacity will grow with the demand of US and western markets." He continued, "The Republic of Equatorial Guinea intends to construct a second LNG terminal at Punta Europa which will act as a hub for LNG monetization in the Gulf of Guinea region."

Equatorial Guinean Natural Gas, is condensed at Punta Europa where it is loaded onto vessels for a two week journey to Elba Island, Georgia. LNG offloaded at Elba Island enters pipelines that provide energy to individuals and businesses in South Georgia and Florida.
