
- A. Develop a strategy for U.S.-Japan summit meetings including speeches and public appearances for participants from Japan.

- E. Consult on critical issues as they arise, and provide assistance in writing op-eds and making media appearances.



At the time of termination of the contract, the Advisors will submit an advisory report with regard to the issues described in (1) with an invoice. The Embassy will promptly pay the compensation after the confirmation of the fulfillment of the contract.


(3). The period of this contract shall be from February 20, 2007 to March 31, 2007.
